More Pay for Judges, Cabinet Ministers, M. Ps. and Senators.

The following is a summary of the new scale of salaries to judges and members of parliament. It will be observed that former cabinet ministhe first time a state salary is to be paid the leader of the opposition.

The indemnity of members and Senators is increased by a thousand dollars a session. The higher judges in all the provinces get increases of \$2,000 a year, and county court judges increases from \$600 to \$1,500.

The salary of the prime minister is increased from \$8,000 to \$12,000, in ad dition to sessional indemnity. The cabinet ministers' salaries are not increased. They only benefit to the extent of the \$1,000 indemnity in-

Members and Senators get \$20 a day to thirty days, and if a session extends beyond that time the indemnity is \$2,500. Formerly the indemnity was \$1,500. The recognized leader of the opposition, in additional to his sessional allowance, gets \$7,000. Instead of twenty cents gets \$7,000. Instead of twenty cents a mile travelling expenses a member of parliament is allowed expenses for one trip to and from Ottawa a session. Payments are made to members monthly and there is the same provision as at present for making provision as at present for making an affidavit of attendance. A deduction of \$15 a day is to be made for non-attendance.

Every member of the Privy Council of Canada who has served as a cabinet minister and head of a department for the full period of five consecutive years shall upon his retirement from the cabinet be entitled to receive, out of the consolidated revenue fund of Canada, an annuity equal to one-half of the salary attached to his office or posi tion at the time of his retirement. Any such councillor obtaining government office or becoming leader of the opposition shall have his salary or allowance reduced by the amount of such annuity.
