KITCHENER'S DIFFICULTY IN INDIA.

Says Marquis de Fontenoy: In order to understand Lord Kitchener's threat to resign the command in chief of the British army in India it is necessary to explain that Major General Sir Edmund Roche Elles, the military member of the so-called council or cabinet of the viceroy, has virtually usurped the functions of a secretary of state of war, and contends that he should be left in supreme control of all the supply, contract, commissariat and armament departments of the British forces in India. In this he is sustain ed by Lord Curzon and by the council, who think it well that these branches of army administration should remain subject to them rather than to the commander in chief.

Inasmuhe, however, as the entire success of all military operations depends upon transport, support and armament, and as Lord Kitchener both in Egypt and in South Africa showed himself to be a past master in their administration, he declines to command the Indian army unless they are left under his absolute control instead of being directed over his head by an officer of much inferior rank and of relatively obscure antecedents.

NEW SECRETARY OF NAVY.


