JAPS IN KOREA.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 30th. The official Russian news agency has received a despatch from Shanghai giving a sensational account of the manner in which the Japanese forced the Russian government to acquiesce. The treaty between Korea and Japan, the telegram purports to be based on news from Seoul, and notes the following particulars:

On Friday, Nov. 24th, Baron Hayashi and Mr. Harivari and Kokubu entered the palace with the object of forcing the emperor to sign the treaty. The emperor and the ministers obstinately refused. At 8 o'clock in the evening Baron Hayashi, having informed the Marquis Ito of the situation the latter, accompanied by General Hasegawa, commander of the Japanese troops in Korea, with a military escort including gendarmes, came to the palace but till midnight had not succeeded in persuading the emperor to sign. Thereupon Secretary Stevens brought from the ministry of foreign affairs the official seal of the ministry, which was obtained by force, and at 1.30 o'clock in the morning the Japanese themselves placed the seal on the treaty.

The despatch concludes: "The entire palace, even the apartments of the emperor, are now occupied by Japanese gendarmes, and it is probably that the Japanese will soon compel the emperor to sign."

POLITICAL.

The by-elections last week resulted in government successes in West Lambton, North York and Antigonish. In Wentworth the conservatives carried the day by eight majority. The liberals talk of protesting the seat.

Two Federal vacancies exist in Saskatchewan, caused by the resignation of Hon. Walter Scott and his attorney general J. H. Lamont, who both went into local politics. Compton, Que., is also vacant, the courts having unseated A. B. Hunt, the recent liberal member who defeated Rufus Pope last fall.

The pensions to ex-cabinet ministers may be revised at the next session of the house. Probably the pension should not apply until the beneficiary has reached the age of 65, or is in need of the grant through poverty. The increased indemnity to the M.P.s cannot very well be rescinded. A man who is not worth \$2500 a year is not fit to go to Ottawa to represent any intelligent constituency. The people have it in their own hands to select the men. If they send a member who is no good they alone are to blame.

THE FRUIT GROWERS.

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE ASSOCIATION WILL BE HELD IN FREDERICTON.

The annual meeting of the New Brunswick Fruit Growers' Association will be held in Fredericton probably during the month of January and in connection with the Farmers' and Dairymen's meeting.

The Fruit Growers Association propose to have a pretty large prize list for exhibits of winter apples, and a nice show is expected to result.

There will be prizes offered for the best plates of five of a kind for about twenty different varieties and for a collection of 10 different kinds there will be prizes amounting to \$10 as well as prizes amounting to \$5 for the best packed box of apples for export.

Seven Years in Jail.

Hamilton, Nov. 20.—T. Hillhouse Brown, ex-manager of the east end branch of the Bank of Hamilton, pleaded guilty at the Police Court to three serious charges, two to embezzling \$7,100 belonging to the bank, one of forging the signature of the inspector. George Lynch Staunton made a plea of lency on the ground that Brown was already a ruined man, and that if his advice had been followed a plea of insanity would have been put in, as doctors had assured him Brown's mind was affected.

The magistrate sentenced the prisoner to Kingston Penitentiary for seven years, expressing at the same time his regret at having to perform such a painful duty.
