Hemstitching by Machine.

Prepare the linen by measuring for the hem and drawing the threads at the top, as for regular hemstitching. Turn over the raw edge and baste and fold down the hem, basting so that the turned edge comes directly in the middle of the drawn threads. Loosen the tension of the machine, put the work under the presser foot, hem side up, and stitch close to the turned edge. Now hold the work firmly with the left hand and with the right draw the hem down until the stitches are drawn to the bottom of the drawn threads. 
