

## Revolving Bed Surface Planer.

SPECIALLY ADAPTED FOR SURFACING GREEN, ICY, WET OR THICK LUMBER.

The above cut represents our **REVOLVING BED PLANER**, with Straight Feed Belt. It planes 24 inches wide and from 1-16 to 8 inches thick. The Cylinder is solid forged steel, with two knives. The bearings run in self oiling long journals. The rolls are weighted at each end. The bed is raised or lowered, to suit thickness of lumber, by power. It has two speeds for feeding and all latest improvements. Pulleys on Cylinders are 5 in. diameter by 5 in. face, and should run at about 3,000 or 3,500 revolutions per minute. Counter Shaft with fast and loose Pulleys: fast Pulley 12x64 and loose Pulley 10x64, with a flange, so that belt will be loose when not in operation, and two 24 in. Pulleys, 5 in. face, the shaft making 625 revolutions per minute. For further particulars apply to

### ROBERT FLEMING DIES IN KANSAS CITY.

Many Carleton County people will be sorry to hear of the death of Robert Fleming. The following notice is taken from *Word and Way* published in Kansas City.

Fleming—Robert Fleming was born April 24, 1855, in Carleton County, Canada, and died February 23, 1905, at the residence of his daughter, Mrs. Z. Nason, 838 Osage avenue, Kansas City, Kansas. He was brought up a Presbyterian, his father being a pioneer missionary along the St. John river. Through the influence of his wife whose ancestry was for many generations strictly Baptist, he was baptized into the fellowship of the Armourdale Baptist church of Kansas City, Kansas, November 1, 1883, in which he continued a consistent member until his death. He married Miss Lucy S. Hovey, March 22, 1880, and settled upon a farm where he lived until his removal to Kansas in 1893. He was a successful farmer and held various positions of trust in his native country. He has a brother, John Fleming, in Minneapolis, and two sisters who are widows, Mrs. William Kerr, Bangor, Maine, and Mrs. Lizzy Cluff, Auburn, Maine. His nephew James E. Fleming, is a member of the Provincial parliament from Carleton County, a leader of his party and a noted temperance orator. Brother Fleming lost a son, Horace Fleming, on March 22, 1894. He leaves a widow and the following children: Colonel Fred W. Fleming, Kansas City, Mo.; Robert E. Fleming, Lafayette, New Jersey, and the M. wife of Dr. Z. Nason. The doctor is a prominent physician, a director of the Kansas City Baptist Theological seminary and a trustee of the Armourdale Baptist church, of which he and his wife are members.


