



Death of Mrs. Anna H. Foster.


Death has again invaded our commnnity, and again seized upon a pioneer citizen of this coast-one of

pioneer citizen of this coast—one of the argonauts whose coming helped to make history in this Golden West. Mrs. Anna H. Foster died at her home in Kelseyville Saturday morn-ing, February 25, 1905, aged 76 years, 6 months and 18 days. Anna Moores was born at Bear Is-land, York County, New Brunswick, in 1828. At the age of 19 she married Ahaima Smith, a lumberman from Maine, and after living at her home place some time, moved with her husband to Woodstock and kept hotel. In 1862 they came around the Horn to California and resided in San Francisco for the space of about 30 years, locating at that place when the embryo city still had its water front where Third and Montgomery streets now are. About 1885—or some 19 years ago—Mr. and Mrs. streets now are. About 1885-or some 19 years ago-Mr. and Mrs. Smith moved to Lake County, loca-ting in Scots Valley, at which point Mr. Smith died. In 1888 the widow married Mr. W. L. Foster, and soon moved to this place, where her hus-band was so long and favorably known in the real estate business and as an intelligent and progressive citizen. On the 19th of June, 1903, Mr. Foster died, and the widow con-tinued her residence here, with her niece, Miss Bertha Keys and most of the time her stepson, Frank Foster, to care for her. 




