## The Ocean Race.

The great interest taken by the public generally in the Ocean race by yachts for Emperor William's cup should surprise no one, seeing its international character and the rarity of such a contest.

No fewer than eleven well-found yachts started from New York in a race to the Lizard (Cornwall, England)—a distance of over three thousand miles. These are (taking them according to their size):—The Earl of Crawford's ship Valhalla, length 239 ft. 6 in., tonnage 447.78, nationality British; Mr Edmund Randolph's bark Apache, length 180 ft., tonnage 307.16, nationality American; Mr Allison V. Armour's schooner Udonawa, length 155 ft., tonnage 286.63, nationality American; Lord Brassey's schooner Sunbeam, length 154 ft. 7 in., tonnage 228.79, nationality British; Mr Wilson Marshall's schooner Atlantic, length 135 ft., tonnage 206.58, nationality American; German Syndicate's schooner Hamburg, length 116 ft., tonnage 134, nationality German; Mr Robert E. Tod's schooner Thistle, length 110 ft., tonnage 235 nationality American; Mr Edward R. Coleman's schooner Hildgarde, length 103 ft. 4 in., tonnage 145.93 nationality American; Mr George Lauder, junior's, schooner Eudymion, length 101 ft., tonnage 116, nationality American; Mr H. S. Redmond's yawl Ailsa, length 88 ft. 10 in., tonnage 116.20, nationality American; and Dr L. A. Stinson's schooner Fleur De Lys, length 86 ft. 6 in., tonnage 86, nationality American.

Though, as will be seen, eight of the yachts float the American flag, only six are the products of American skill and five were built in British yards, viz.: the Valhalla, Sunbeam, Hamburg, Ailsa and Apache.

### ANNEX THE WEST INDIES.

A suggestion was made the other day in the British House of Commons that certain of the West India Islands become members of the Canadian Confederation. This is a sensible view, and one we are surprised to think has not been acted upon long ago. The British West Indies would greatly benefit by the increased facilities for trade which would be derived by a union with Canada. Jamaica, Barbadoes, Bermuda and the smaller islands and groups belonging to Britain are large importers of flour and other breadstuffs. Canadian manufacturers would find a good market on these islands of the sea. The sugar, tobacco, fruits, spices and other products of the West Indies would be admitted to this country free of duty which would stimulate the production of these articles. Then there is a large sentimental element that deserves consideration. All the British possessions in North America should become members of the Dominion. Newfoundland and the other backward portions of John Bull's heritage in the Western Hemisphere should be encouraged to throw off their diffidence and be received as members of this great and glorious confederation, destined some day we believe to dominate the Western World.

Another enthusiastic carnival meeting was held Friday night. There was a large attendance. Reports were submitted by various committees. The collectors announced that about \$900 would be in their hands. It was unanimously decided to ask the town for a grant of \$200 out of the miscellaneous account. The grand trades and fancy parade will be held on the morning of the second day.

### With Strawberries.

A sweet cake baked in layers with whole berries spread between and garnished with beaten cream piped in fanciful design is not a genuine short cake. The real article is entirely devoid of sweetening and is made flaky and "short" with butter possibly cream; in fact, it is a "short bread." Bake it in one sheet and split with a hot knife; crush the berries slightly and saturate with sugar for a half hour, then make the filling generous after the lower half of the cake has been buttered. Serve a spoonful extra of the berries with each piece and do not smother the top with whipped cream, for the epicure knows that plain thick cream is the kind to serve with strawberry shortcake.

### LIPTON WANTS THE CUP.

Nice, May 24.—Sir Thomas Lipton has been cruising in the Mediterranean in his yacht Erin for a month past. He had among the guests on the Erin, when she arrived at Villefranche Harbor, the Prince and Princess Philip of Bourbon. When asked about the America's Cup, he said: "The assertion that I have given up all hopes of lifting the cup is absurd. I shall be back in London probably by the 1st of June. I have profited by experience, and am consulting the best designers in Great Britain in order to secure a yacht and a rig that will have a chance of successfully meeting the next America's Cup defender. I hope to find a designer and a yacht that will win. I hope to have the new challenger in hand by July next—that is, the design. I am firmly determined that as long as I live I shall not be satisfied until the cup is brought over to our side of the Atlantic. I'm going to keep on trying, no matter what it costs, to lift the cup."
