WANT NO INTERFERENCE.

People of the Northwest and the School Question.

"The unanimous sentiment in the Northwest is that we should strongly resent any interference on the part of the Dominion Government in dealing with our educational matters. We want to be left as free to deal with them as the other Provinces that have come into confederation since 1867. I believe we would not accept autonomy if there were attached to it any rider affecting our educational system." This was the view expressed to a Globe reporter yesterday by Mr. R. J. Hutchings, President of the Calgary Board of Trade and Chairman of the school board. It was unqualifiedly concurred in by Mr. J. Emerson, Mayor of the city after five years' service as Alderman. Both gentlemen who are guests at the King Edward, are on their way home from Ottawa, where last week they headed a deputation of twelve from their city which waited upon Premier Laurier in connection with questions arising out of proposed creations of two new Provinces in the Northwest.

They were surprised, they said, to find so much being made of their school question in older Canada. In the Northwest there was no dissatisfaction; the separate school system was distinct in name only, the text books, regulations, standards for teachers and everything else were the same as in the public schools, and were, like the latter, under the supervision of Government inspectors. The people of the northwest felt they were able to manage their own school affairs, and they did not want any clauses in the constitution which the Federal Parliament would give to the prospective Provinces binding them and their successors to any particular system or scheme of education.

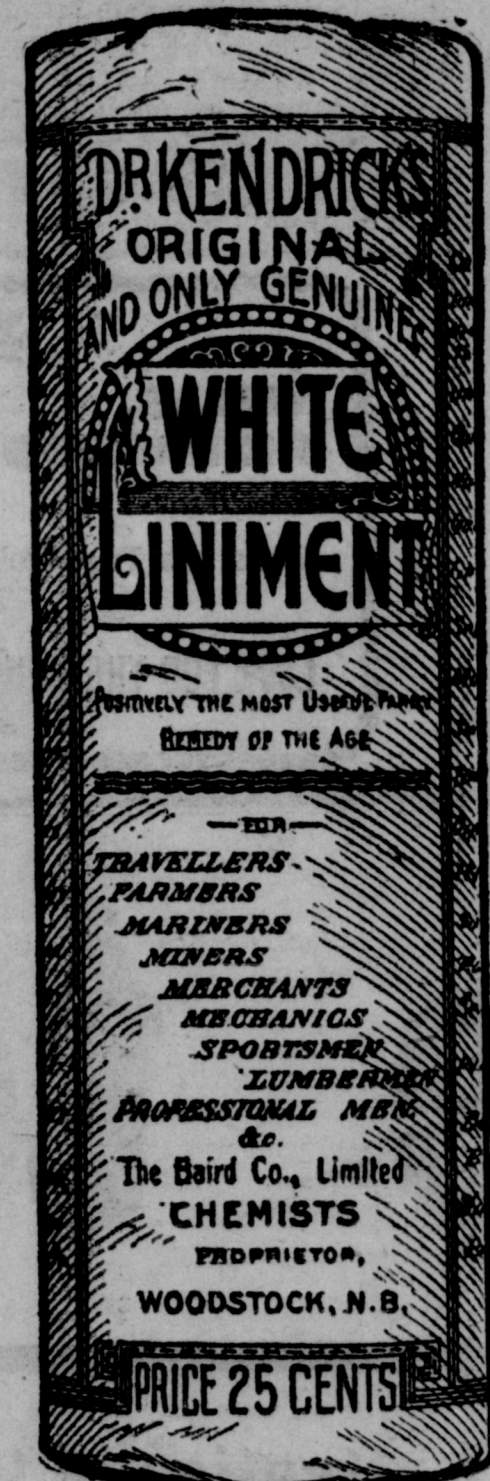

An Interesting Cow Census.

At the Eastern Ontario Dairy-men's Convention Mr. C. F. Whitley of the Dairy Commissioner's Branch, Ottawa, gave a very interesting account of cow census which he conducted in the vicinity of Cowansville, Que., during the summer of 1901. Under his supervision seventy two farmers kept daily milk records of their cows and three times a month took samples for testing from the milk of each individual cow in their dairies. In this way reasonably accurate figures were obtained.

For the month of June the general average of all the herds tested was 652 lbs of milk, yielding 25 lbs of fat. In one case twenty-two cows had a yield for the month of 17,945 lbs of milk and 722.5 lbs of fat, an average per cow of 811 lbs of milk and 32.4 lbs of fat. In another herd of eleven cows, every animal was below the general average, the range being as low as 280 lbs to 805 lbs of milk per cow, and this herd consisted of Jersey, Guernsey, Ayrshire and Holstein grades and natives. In contrast to this, another herd of twelve cows of similar breeding yielded from 830 to 115 lbs per cow, so that every cow in the herd was above the average. This shows that the flow of milk depends upon the individuality of the cows even more than upon their breeding.

In the month of July a herd of twenty-seven cows, Jersey, Ayrshire, Holstein and Shorthorn grades, gave 13,780 lbs of milk and 473.7 lbs of fat, an average of 509 lbs of milk and 17.5 lbs of fat per cow. This was typical

of several herds consisting of mixed grades. The average record per cow is poor, noticeably below the average of the whole 1120 cows for July. The best showing was made by a Holstein grade, whose record is more than double that of the poorest cow. This dairy had five more cows than the first mentioned, and yet produced 4,000 lbs less milk in the month. Another July record showed that one herd of six cows gave 2515 lbs of milk, while another dairy of twelve cows gave 8,920 lbs; twice as many cows gave over three times as much milk. In September one lot of twenty-three cows gave 8,120 lbs of milk, and another lot of twenty-three yielded 11,200 lbs. These records emphasize the need for knowing definitely the production of each individual cow.

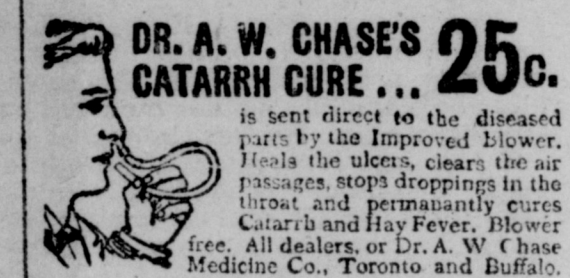

New Canadian Territory.

Ellesmere Land, which has just been annexed by the Canadian Government, is intimately associated with the voyages of Parry, Franklin, Nares, McClintock, and other explorers of the Arctic regions. All the territories included under the name have nominally belonged to the British empire since 1819, when they were claimed on behalf of George III. by Sir Wm. E. Parry, at that time Lieut. Parry, on his first voyage to the Arctic. Ellesmere Island, or, as it is termed, Ellesmere Land, consists of eighteen thousand square miles; North Devon, another island, has an area of twenty-two thousand square miles; and North Somerset is ten thousand square miles in extent. They have heretofore been classified as part of the Northwest Territory called Franklin, in memory of Sir John Franklin. The territory is five hundred and ninety thousand square miles in extent, and consists of all the Arctic islands belonging to British North America. Ellesmere Land is separated from Greenland by Smith Sound, and possesses a range of mountains rising from one to five thousand feet above the level of the sea. The islands are by no means unpopulated, though, so far as is known, no census has ever been taken. The inhabitants, of course, are Esquimaux.
