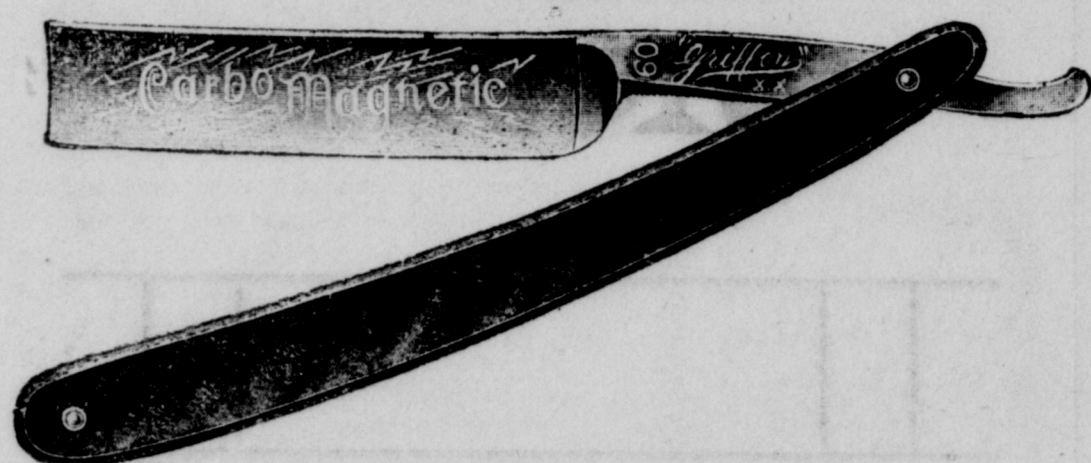

That Increased Indemnity.

Certain disgruntled politicians and a few newspapers following in their wake, loudly condemn the recent increase in the sessional indemnity to senators and members of the commons. It may unfortunately be true that the increased remuneration is more than some of the recipients could earn in any other capacity, yet the great majority of the representatives at Ottawa fully deserve all they get, and many sit at a large pecuniary loss, even under the new conditions.

The churches of Great Britain are more thoroughly interested in social questions than those on this side of the water. For instance the Congregational Union of England and Wales, at its recent meeting, declared by an almost unanimous vote that there ought to be a government bureau to provide employment for all persons willing to work. The union is still fighting vigorously against the education bill, and it is reported that last year fifty-two thousand summons for non-payment of the school rate had been issued, and that one thousand, nine hundred and thirty-six persons had had their goods sold for refusing to pay the rate, and that a hundred and ninety-three persons had gone to jail.

PHENOMENAL DRIVES IN GOLF.

"Would you kindly tell me what is the distance an average golf player can drive a ball from the tee. I think it should be between 300 and 400 yards."

The correspondent who writes in these terms to *The News* has another think coming to him.

Under the most favorable conditions a ball has never been driven 400 yards.

Possibly the longest drive ever made was that of Walter J. Travis, the ex-American champion, who sent the ball 382 yards. But that was on a frozen field covered with ice and down hill.

Almost as good a record is that of Edward Blackwell, who only recently on the links at St. Andrews, England, drove the ball from the eighteenth tee to the steps of the club house, a distance of 380 odd yards.

George S. Lyon, the Canadian amateur champion, who is considered one of the best drivers in America, certainly the best in Canada, sent a ball 327 yards in the tournament at St. Louis last year. But this also was down grade.

Chandler Egan, whose achievements on the links have recently come in for considerable attention in the golfing world, has also made some very long drives.

The average drive, however, would not be more than 180 yards. When the ball goes further than that there are some special conditions which lend their aid to the player. With the wind against him, the average player would not be able to send the ball further than 150 or 160 yards.—*Toronto News.*
