Canadian Foresters' Hall Dedicated at Cloverdale, N. B.

Sept 6th just past, opened a very wet rainy day much to the ill wishing of all Canadian Foresters in this county and adjoining counties as that was the day of the Cloverdale Forester picnic and also for the date set for the dedication of the Canadian Foresters' hall by Court Alpine No 923 of Cloverdale, N. B. Although the rain came drizzling down yet a very nice little group of ladies and gentlemen mostly Foresters and their wives, daughters and sisters gathered to dinner which was served on the grounds and during the afternoon people came flocking in until it was a revelation how people were interested in this event of Forestry. Wm Doig, manager of the Canadian Foresters for the maritime provinces, arrived from St John N. B., S G Barter, assistant organizer, and other Foresters who spoke from a platform to the crowd. At 8 p. m. they repaired to the hall recently completed by the members of Court Alpine where the beautiful ceremony of the dedication of a O O F hall was witnessed by the public as the ceremony was made public. Wm Doig acted as High Chief Ranger of the order, S G Barter, organizer, as High Marshall assisted by Bro Foresters from other courts of this and York County. After the ceremony Bro Wm Doig a gifted speaker made a most interesting and instructive address; his words were eagerly listened to and the hour he spoke was short to all and the longer he spoke the better the speech, was the comment of all present. Bro Hagerman of Court Hartland No 707 followed and as he was a delegate who attended the last session of the High Court at Gananoque last summer he was also eagerly received and his short address was a good one. S G Barter followed in a happy vein of pleasure as he was the organizer of Court Alpine and its triumph was his victory as well as the members of that court.
