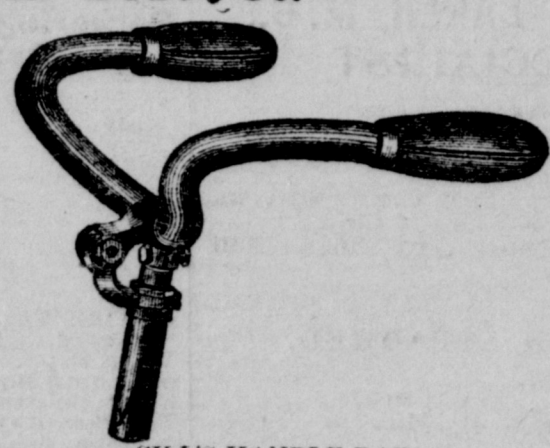

It promotes the comfort of riding by removing the strain upon the arms and hands so that the weight of the body may be thrown forward over the front fork without any possibility of the hands being cramped or the grasp loosened by the vibration that would otherwise be set up were the handle bars rigid. The Sill's Bars take up and absorb the vibration from both directions, because the action of the spring is controlled by a hinged part which directs the movement of the bars in a downwards and forwards tilting motion. The purpose of the spring is to supply a cushion to "give" under the pressure of the arms. The hinged part strengthens the steering post and leaves the operation of steering no less sure and easy than it is with bicycles having rigid handle bars.

Grand Falls.

Harry Dunbar, Woodstock, who was here all last week superintending the installation of the new gang in Burgess mill, has completed his labors and returned home. During his sojourn in town he was the guest of Matthew Burgess.

The Commercial Hotel, formerly managed by Fred Howard, is being renovated and improved interior and exteriorly preparatory to being reopened to the public by the Mr Armstrong, who has leased the building.

E B Raymond, an old Grand Falls boy, who went west about thirty years ago, has been appointed chief of the fire department of the city of Olympia, Wash.

Father Joyner is now arranging the preliminaries for a monster picnic and bazaar in August. Excursions will be run from Woodstock, Edmundston, Presque Isle and probably Fredericton. An elaborate programme of sports is being prepared, and in the evening a thrilling five act drama will be presented. The picnic will be the event of the year.

Grand Falls will again this summer be the scene of a two day's carnival, horse trot, aerial exhibition on a wire rope stretched across the falls, and other sports and attractions. Gallagher Bros., Woodstock, are now completing their plans for a circuit of races which will include Woodstock, Bristol, Grand Falls, Clair and Edmundston. Grand Falls will, however, be the centre of the big events. Excursions from Houlton, Woodstock, and Presque Isle will convey thousands to town. Prof Morrell has again been secured to perform his thrilling nerve-wrecking, and dangerous feat of walking across the cataraact on a slender, swaying wire. He will perform other difficult saltatory and balancing feats when in midstream on the wire, besides waltzing, standing on his head, turning somersaults, &c. Professional base ball clubs from across the border will play a series of games each day, and considering the natural attractions of the place, Grand Falls expects the largest crowd ever assembled in Victoria County.
