Annual Exhibition Northern Maine Fair.

The Northern Maine Fair Association will hold its annual Fair at Presque Isle, on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, Sept. 4th 5th and 6th. The track exhibition will take place on Wednesday and Thursday, the 5th and 6th, with the following program.

Preparatory to the coming Fair, the Society has made extensive improvements upon the track and ground. The track has been thrown up at the turns, and by the addition of several inches of fine loam, has been made one of the best half-mile tracks in the State. The Society has purchased T H Phair's stable at the track, which gives them accommodations for about fifty horses. A galvanized iron tank with a capacity of about 75 bbls has been constructed, from which pipes have been laid to carry water to different parts of the ground, where it may be needed for the accommodation of people and stock. In addition to these improvements a large building is being put up for the better housing of the poultry exhibit, which is becoming one of the best features of the Fair, and also a building for the accommodation of the different official departments of the society.

Obituary, Buckwheat, and the Mayor.

To the Editor of Carleton Sentinel:—

I feel impressed to state to what few friends living who remember it that fifty-nine years ago to-day (15th Aug) my precious mother slipped away from her earthly coil to her mansion in that blissful place prepared for all God's faithful followers leaving about her dying couch a sad father and eleven heart-broken children, to struggle with the vacuum in that happy home, a vacancy that has never been filled. Her going away came on Sunday, just after sunset, a scene never to be forgotten by those who witnessed the happy flight of that mother in Israel. She was a woman of meek and quiet nature and loved by all who knew her, but her personal work on earth was finished, but the seed she sowed bears fruit still. How fresh in my memory is that scene. Kind friends lent all the help and comfort they could and prepared the body for burial. The next day, Monday, the coffin was made at the home by a Gardner, a carpenter who used to live near the Getchell Mill, now Waterville. The preacher in charge was William Pennington and after a comforting prayer at the family altar and at the appointed hour, old Dr Gray, undertaker from the lower corner Woodstock came driving his large black horse to the hearse with the calm fresh sadness, but it was all necessary to be done. The coffin with the precious treasure was placed by tender hands in the hearse and a very long procession formed and started to Victoria Corner and in the old meeting house gathered a weeping family and many sympathizing friends and after a sermon and a comforting talk to the mourners the casket was taken to the old cemetery on the banks of the old St John river and covered from view of mortal eyes to await the last call to that great and notable day of the Lord, the judgment, and as we went sadly back to our desolate home, the sun being about an hour high, there appeared a large bright star a few degrees above it, a sight not often seen. But with these sad resolutions, there is a bright side to it all, fifty-nine years in glory and with the Blessed Redeemer and the holy Angels, but we imagine it has seemed but a brief space of time to her. Since that time her husband aged ninety-two years, two sons and three daughters, have gone to be with her, leaving six of us here still to struggle with life, and prepare to meet her. How few people are alive to-day that knew of what I have here stated outside of our own family. But we all will soon be gone and forgotten by the living. If we are so ungratefully happy as to land our bark safe on that Golden Shore how many more friends we will know than we know here.

I see in yours of the 10th inst, among other interesting things some one reports a fine crop of buckwheat. That almost made my mouth water for those fine griddle cakes I used so much to enjoy, stacked as they were cooked and each buttered as the stack grew as high as a beaver hat but I was always eager to get the top cake that had been last buttered. Mr Editor could you enjoy such a treat? I know you would only smile.

There seems to be a thorn in the flesh of your honored Mayor. I used to know a Donald Munro, who may be a descendant of his. He used to be considered a man of good sense and judgment. I think Coun Leighton has the good of the town at heart and his resolution should have carried by all means. But, but that mayor, yet there may be something behind that does not yet appear. I always am a strong advocate for patronizing home enterprise, home capital and energetic people. I think some of our city fathers need broader views and higher ambitions than small personalities. Be men among men and build up your old town or city as you are pleased to style it and let the lion and lamb lie close to each other.
