Britain's Navy Still Far Ahead.

A great battle has raged in political circles in England recently over Nitrous Oxide Gas used for the Painless Extraction of Teeth. the naval programme, with the result that the party recommending a decrease has won a victory. It was originally planned to lay down four battleships of the type of the Dreadnought. The Admiralty insisted that this was necessary in order to maintain the traditional policy by which the navy is to be equal to the combined fleets of the two next powerful nations. However a party in the Cabinet was determined to reduce expenditure, and after a bitter struggle it was decided that three battleships of the Dreadnaught class should be laid down instead of four ; that two torpedo boats should be built instead of five, and that there should be eight new submarines instead of twelve.
