Toronto and Montreal are having a hard fight for the cellar position. Toronto is in the hole now, but the Royals are sliding fast and will likely reach the concrete before the end of the season.

Britain's Navy Still Far Ahead.

A great battle has raged in political circles in England recently over the naval programme, with the result that the party recommending a decrease has won a victory. It was originally planned to lay down four battleships of the type of the Dreadnought. The Admiralty insisted that this was necessary in order to maintain the traditional policy by which the navy is to be equal to the combined fleets of the two next powerful nations. However a party in the Cabinet was determined to reduce expenditure, and after a bitter struggle it was decided that three battleships of the Dreadnought class should be laid down instead of four; that two torpedo boats should be built instead of five, and that there should be eight new submarines instead of twelve.

The expenditure as originally estimated was \$76,000,000. In the new

programme submitted to parliament it is reduced to \$57,500,000.

EQUAL TO ANY THREE NOW.

As a matter of fact the British navy is at present equal to any three, and in 1910 will be more than equal to a combination of the two next most powerful navies. In respect to battleships afloat or in course of construction, the situation is as follows:

Ships.	Tonnage
England.....51	745,010
Germany.....24	255,551
France.....17	215,717
Russia.....8	110,952
As for armoured cruisers these are the figures:	
England.....48	538,800
France.....15	68,363
Russia.....4	47,432

In respect to warships in course of construction England has 6 battleships and 10 cruisers; France, 12 battleships and 5 cruisers; Germany, 8 battleships and 3 cruisers; and Russia, 4 battleships and 4 cruisers.

HOW IT WILL BE IN 1910.

Lord Brassey, the great naval authority, who gives the above figures, reckons that in 1910 the number of battleship less than twenty-five years old will be as follows:

Ships.	Tonnage
England.....56	815,000
France.....28	381,500
Germany.....24	287,000
Russia.....15	185,000
The figures for cruisers in 1910, less than 20 years old, are these:	
England.....38	482,000
France.....23	219,400
Germany.....8	79,900
Russia.....9	100,800

In respect of men England will have 129,000; France, 62,400; Germany, 40,822; and the United States, 45,000.

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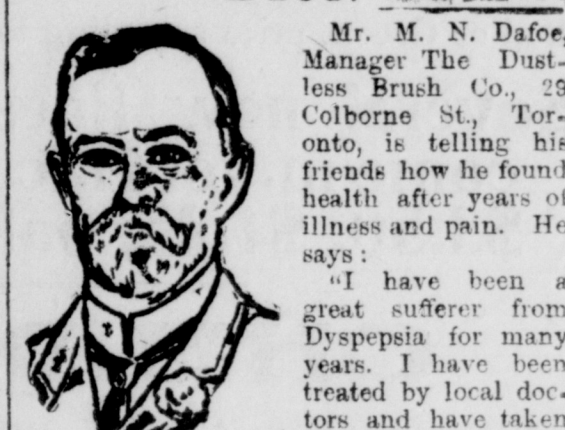
SECOND CALL FOR HELP.
