### THE HOME DOCTOR.

Remove warts by rubbing several times with onion dipped in salt. Butter will take the soreness from a bruise and will often prevent discoloration.

When the gums are tender and bleeding, the mouth should be rinsed with warm water to which listerine has been added.

Grape fruit is said to have, in smaller degree, qualities similar to those of quinine and will allay inflammation and break up malarial disorders if taken in time.

Never neglect a sore throat. A good gargle can be made by mixing in equal quantities a teaspoonful of salt and carbonate of soda and dissolving these in half a tumbler of cold water.

A splendid laxative slurrup may be made as follows: Put a half pound of raisins, prunes and figs to soak in three pints of cold water. Bottle the slurrup after two days and take one tablespoonful night and morning.

**Cloth Cold Without Ice.**  
In case of fever or weakness, a cloth on the forehead or face or back of the brain is one of the most comforting things in the world. In the tropical hospitals and where ice is scarce all that is necessary is to wet a linen cloth, wave it to and fro in the air, fold it and place it on the patient. Have another cloth ready, waving it to and fro just before applying it. These cloths have a more grateful and lasting coolness than those made so by the extreme cold, sometimes called burning cold or ice.

**For a Business Woman.**  
One good tailored suit, spring and fall; plain smart waists to wear with this to the office; a fancy waist to freshen it up for the theater and Sundays; a rainy day skirt and coat for bad weather; a trim, rather small and becoming hat; a comfortable house gown to slip on when she goes home at night. The above may seem like a modest wardrobe, but for the woman who is in business to win and who hasn't much time to fool over clothes it may be taken as a safe guide.—Chicago News.

**Salted Pecans.**  
Salted pecans are even more delicious than salted almonds. They are rarely prepared at home for the reason that the nuts are difficult to remove from the shells without breaking the meats. This difficulty is entirely overcome by pouring boiling water over the nuts, letting the water cool on them. Crack by stuffing small ends of nuts and salted almonds.

### SOFA CUSHIONS.

A Novel Idea Is to Have Them Heart Shaped and Large.

New ideas in sofa cushions are always welcome, for the average household cannot own too many cushions to suit the feminine members, though there may be an occasional masculine protest against an excess in supply. The latest notion is to have one or two cushions of heart shape resting on top of the ordinary square pillows, and the result is very good, as the accompanying illustration shows. The cushion is

of large size, somewhat solidly stuffed, six to eight inches thick. For the center the heart shape is cut out in a flat piece of silk, backed, if soft, with coarse linen or stiffer material and set with a wide gauging made to lie flat. Sometimes, as in the example here pictured, a touch of embroidery is added. In perfectly plain corded silk without adornment the heart cushion makes an admirable accessory to the sofa furnishing. Broderie anglaise on ivory lawn, lined with one of the colors dominant in the room, makes an excellent covering for such a cushion, the gauging being dispensed with in favor of a flat shaped border of the openwork.—Brooklyn Eagle.

### FAMILY MEALS.

Don't Let Ceremony Crush Out Cheerfulness and Sociability.

A certain amount of ceremony should be observed even at the simplest family meal, but when this is carried too far it crushes sociability and cheerfulness.

One should be careful not to eat so rapidly that the food may not be properly masticated or that one will have finished while the others at the table are still eating. If it is necessary to ask for anything during a meal, one should take the opportunity of speaking quietly to the waitress when she is near or wait until it is possible to catch her eye.

When a meal is announced go to the table promptly. It is annoying to the housekeeper and cook to have the meals delayed. It often happens that a few minutes' waiting may spoil some dish, and in any case it causes a waste of precious time to the housekeeper and other members of the family. Some thoughtless people seem to think that it matters less that the whole family is kept waiting five minutes or more than that they should complete the work which they happen to have in hand. There are many jars and breaks in the household machinery from this cause alone.

In many households where there is a regular waitress there is a rule sometimes that nothing shall be handed by the members of the family.

In offering to serve any one at the table use one of these forms: "May I help you?" "May I offer [or send] you?" "Let me give you," etc. The form "Will you have?" is out of place save for a waitress, who is usually trained to wait on the table in silence.
