## Where There Are No Doctor's Bills.

What a happy land should Sweden be, since it is a land where the doctors never send out any bills. The Swedish system is based upon honor, public spirit, and self-esteem, and by no means the least of these is self-esteem. What you pay your doctor is a measure of your prosperity and your estimate of your own worth. If you have nothing, you pay him nothing and all is well. If you have much you pay him much, or fall in his and your own eyes. In the Swedish mind the physician ranks with the Church as an institution to be supported for the common good. Each family "retains" a doctor, contributing a yearly sum to his maintenance regardless of the service he has rendered. Important folk pay about \$125 a year; plain people average about \$25; the poor give a pittance; and paupers go scot free. The rich do not pay for the poor, because all but about three hundred and fifty of Sweden's physicians are to a certain extent supported by the Government to look after the poor. The plan of payment is for each citizen to decide what he ought to devote to this purpose and to send it to the doctor's house on New Year's night, when the messenger returns with the doctor's cards and everything is lovely for another year. It may be added that Sweden has one of the lowest death rates in the world.

Hon Byron Boyd Retires.

By an item in the editorial column of our sprightly contemporary, The Fort Fairfield Review, we learn that Maine is to have a new Secretary of State, as Hon Byron Boyd, the present incumbent, is to retire. Mr Boyd has held the position for many years, and while he has his enemies, seems to have come as near to pleasing the bulk of the people as anyone could possibly do. We would not be surprised to see him fill the governor's chair in a couple of years. He is a son of Dr Boyd of Linneus, and brother of Mrs Hand of this town.

## PROHIBITION IN KANSAS.

Being desirous of ascertaining the attitude of the chief executive of the State of Kansas on the question of Prohibition, with a view to its enactment in our country, we have obtained the following self explanatory document:—Executive Mansion, Topeka, Kas, Oct 25, 1906.

Dear Sir:—Prohibition became a part of the organic law of Kansas a quarter of a century ago. Every possible phase of it has been tested in the courts. Frequent efforts have been made to have it resubmitted to the people but always without success. Every possible effort has been made to discredit the law but it is still popular with the people. It is enforced as well as any other law in a great majority of the counties of the State.

I believe it has been a great benefit to the State financially, intellectually and morally. The State is wonderfully prosperous, has \$129,000,000 in its banks, eighty-three dollars per capita, pauperism is practically unknown, the prison population is but little more than when the State had one-half its present population before the adoption of prohibition.

Hon J E Hurley, general manager to the Santa Fe railroad, in a recent publication, declared that prohibition had been of immense benefit to railroad employees. I do not think there is any likelihood of Kansas renouncing its faith in prohibition.

Tweedie and Pugsley were among the leading advocates of the increase, have been after it for years, and no amount of futile and misleading criticism can rob them of the credit justly due. North Shore periodicals, with the notable exception of the World, are not in a position to criticize anyone adversely. We cannot believe the proprietor will permit his amateur to perpetrate similar jokes in future.

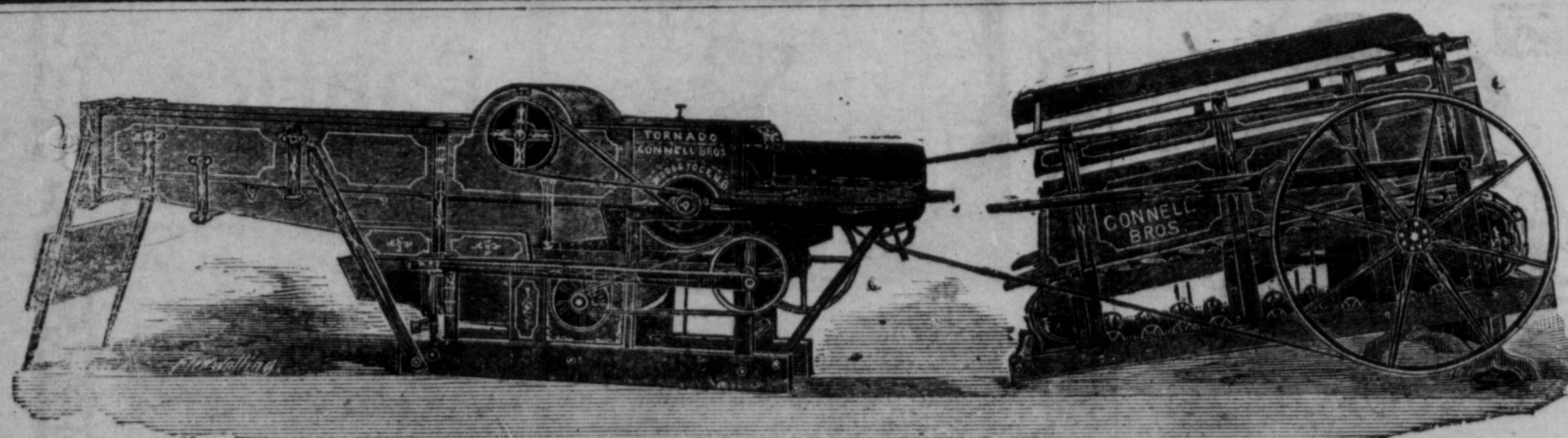
