### Will Appoint an Enumerator.

It is understood that the provision of the Compulsory Schools Act calling for the appointment of an Enumerator of school children will be complied with at an early meeting of the School Board. The Act specifically declares it to be the duty of the Board to appoint an official whose duty it shall be to furnish the Board and the Trust Officer with a list of all children within the ages laid down in the law. It is not known who will receive the appointment, as so far no applications have been sent in. The job will likely be snapped up, however, when the Board gets ready to ask for some one to volunteer his services at so much per day.

Berlin, Oct. 8.—It is reported that the Grand Duke of Hesse, who was divorced from Princess Victoria of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha in 1901, is contemplating a divorce from his second wife, Princess Fleomore of Solms-Pohrenscholms-Lich, whom he married in October, 1905, on the ground of incompatibility.

The circumstances are particularly distressing in view of the expected announcement of the Grand Duchess in November. The Grand Duke left Darmstadt recently, accompanied by his civil adviser and an adjutant, ostensibly to visit Munich, but he actually went to St. Petersburg and Finland, where he consulted his sister, the Czarina, as to the advisability of divorcing his wife. The Czarina strongly disapproved the proposal. The Grand Duke returned yesterday, but left the train at Frankfurt, whence he proceeded in an automobile to his shooting lodge, without visiting Darmstadt.

It is stated that the cause of the estrangement is the divergent tastes of the pair. The Grand Duke, who is 38 years old, is vivacious and imperious, while the Grand Duchess, who is 35, is studious and retiring.

Lady Solomon who was accompanied by Sir Richard Solomon, K. C. M. G., K. C. B., Acting Lieutenant Governor of the Transvaal, recently laid the foundation stone of the Bible House now being erected by the British and Foreign Bible Society at Johannesburg. In the course of his speech Sir Richard said he had a firm belief in the work of the Bible Society, and wished to express his sympathy with those who were engaged in carrying out that work. In this connection it is interesting to note that Scriptures in no less than 52 languages were sold last year from the Bible Society's depot at Johannesburg, and a fifty third language was asked for by a newcomer to the "Golden City" he wanted a Bible in Icelandic—which was unfortunately not in stock at that moment.

Rev Mr. Campbell's resignation was on Saturday last placed in the hands of Thomas Bullock, recording steward in Queen Square Methodist church. In the procedure of the Methodist church this resignation, which is subject to the approval of the conference, will take effect with the next meeting of the conference in June next. Mr. Campbell asks the church to take steps towards filling the pulpit. Rev Mr. Campbell has been provisional secretary of the Canadian Bible Society since its organization on April 26th, 1905, and has given to the work that portion of his time which he was able to give without interfering with his duties as pastor. At the conference of representatives of the Bible Society in the maritime provinces, which was held at Amherst in August last, matters of the district were so settled and arranged that it now becomes necessary for whoever may occupy the position of assistant secretary to devote his whole time to the field.

### THE COADJUTOR BISHOP.

As many of our readers are of the Episcopal faith we give herewith a short sketch of their newly elected Coadjutor.

Rev John Andrew Richardson was born Oct 30th. 1868, in Warwick, Eng being a son of Rev John Richardson. He came to Canada in 1887 and in 1891 entered St John's College, Winnipeg, from which institution he graduated in 1895. He was ordained deacon the same year and priest in 1896, when he became rector of St Luke's church, Fort Rouge, Winnipeg, which until then he had carried on as a mission. In 1899 he received a call from Trinity church of St John and entered upon his duties as rector in August of that year. Since coming to St John, Canon Richardson has been prominently identified in reform and philanthropic work and has given much valuable assistance to various societies that have for their object the alleviation of distress and the uplifting of the people. In his church work he has been singularly successful, being an earnest and thoughtful preacher and indefatigable in his efforts among the younger element of his congregation. Since he became rector of Trinity there have been large additions to the membership, and the parish flourished in every respect. Canon Richardson

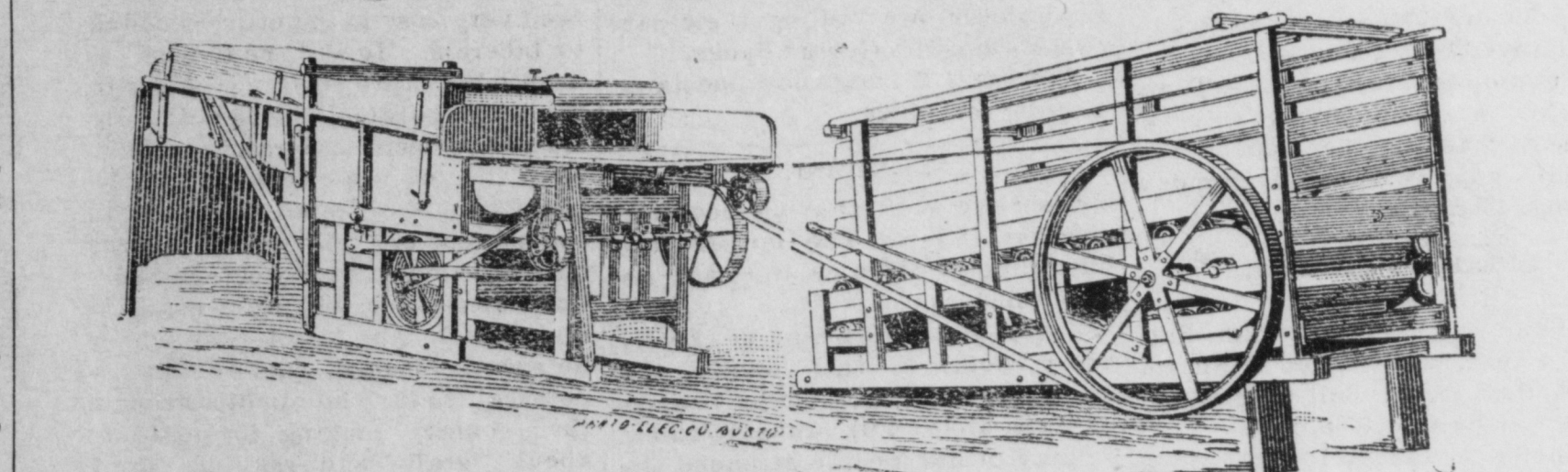
