Funeral of Miss Helen Bridgic Owens.

On Wednesday Jan 31st at 3 o'clock P M was laid to rest in the Catholic grave yard at Johnville, the remains of a bright young lady, Miss Helen B Owens, who died Monday morning of bronchial pneumonia in Lynn. Miss Owens was sick only a few days; was removed to the Hospital on Friday Jan 26th, where all that was possible to be done for her was done, but she passed peacefully away early Monday morning. Her sister Miss Rose Owens, and cousin Miss Eliza Owens, accompanied the body to her childhood's home in Johnville, from where the family moved about ten years ago. They were met at McAdam by her sister and brothers, Mary, John and James Owens, and cousins James McGuire and Sandy Owens. Miss Owens was twenty three years and nine months old. Quite a number of relatives and friends drove and went in the train from Newburg to attend the funeral; teams met the body at Bath station and thence the funeral cortege proceeded to Johnville where her father, mother and little sister also rest.

High Mass of Requiem was celebrated next morning in Johnville, church by Rev Father Coughlan. The family have the sympathy of their many friends in their sad bereavement.

When the existing nine vacancies in the Senate are filled the standing of the two parties will be: Liberals, 55; Conservatives, 32; Ministerial majority, 23. In the short space of nine years a Liberal guard of nine has been converted into a majority of one score and three. Five of the Senate vacancies were caused by death—viz., Senators Black and Church, in Nova Scotia; Senators Wark and Dever, in New Brunswick, and Senator Fulford, in Ontario. The remaining four are new Senatorships given to the Northwest. In the last Parliament the Senate consisted of 81 members, but legislative authority was given to add two to the representation of the Territories. Messrs J H Ross and T O Davis were chosen, and they took their seats for the first time last session. The addition of four more Senatorships gives the Northwest a representation of eight in the Senate, or four from each Province.
