This fact along with the coincidence that two Supreme court judges reside in the same county, seems proof positive that it is well to live in Westmorland. Look at Carleton County in contrast. We have never had a Superior court judge, and never a senator resident within our boundaries. Even our present excellent and popular county court judge is an importation. Is the county, so fertile agriculturally, sterile when it comes to producing great men? Surely not.
