No Closure To Be Applied.

Somebody has started the story
that the Government proposed to
adopt the closure at the coming
session of parliament, and Mr Borden
and his followers are in consequence
badly scared. The whole thing is a
pure fabrication. Responsibility for
it is saddled on the representative of
a Ministerial paper in Montreal, but
the statement of the paper in ques-
tion does not justify any such inter-
pretation. All that is proposed is a
revision of the rules of procedure, as
announced by Sir Wilfrid Laurier
before prorogation last summer, and
concluded in by leading Conserva-
tives. Nobody intends to interfere
with the freedom of speech, although
it costs the country \$250 per hour, or
more sometimes, to listen to remarks
which would be dear at \$5 per diem.
