"Woodstock Elections. The election for Mayor and Councillors under the Act to Incorporate the Town of Woodstock took place on Monday last, and we are happy to say went off quietly, although the contest as may be seen by the returns below, was exceedingly close. There were three candidates for the office of Mayor—viz—Messrs L. P. Fisher, James Robertson and George W. Cleary. As the trial of strength seemed to be between the first two mentioned candidates the different parties appeared unwilling to weaken their numbers, consequently Mr. Cleary got but few votes; and the result was that Mr. Fisher was elected by a majority of twenty."
