SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any numbered section of Dominion
Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Al-
berta, excepting 8 and 28, not reserved, may
be homesteaded by any person who is the
sole head of a family, or any male over 18
years of age, to the extent of one-quarter
section of 160 acres, more or less.

Entry must be made personally at the local
and office for the district in which the land
is situated.

The homesteader is required to perform the
conditions connected therewith under one of
the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and
cultivation of the land in each year for three
years.

(2) If the father (or mother) if the father is
deceased) of the homesteader resides upon a
farm in the vicinity of the land entered for,
the requirements as to residence may be
satisfied by such persons residing with the
father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence
upon farming land owned by him in the
vicinity of his homestead, the requirements
as to residence may be satisfied by residence
upon the said land.

Six months' notice in writing should be
given to the Commissioner of Dominion
Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for
patent.

Poor San Francisco! She seems to have met quite the least of her troubles in her disaster of last April. Things are reported at a standstill by reason of labor controversies and the high rate of wages demanded, and all sorts of graft are being charged. It now appears, according to the Chronicle of that city, that many sums of money, large and small, that were sent from different states for the relief of the sufferers from the calamity, never reached the relief committee. Some of these amounts, which aggregated a large sum, were mailed to the care of Mayor Schmitz. President Roosevelt is the moving spirit behind the inquiry and declares that no man guilty of diverting the relief funds shall escape justice. The cases come within the jurisdiction of the federal authorities, because of the interstate character of the postal service, which it is alleged, was criminally tampered with. A considerable sum of money was also sent through the express companies, which companies are now investigating the disappearance of \$10,580, sent in one package from the citizens of Searchlight, Nevada, which the relief committee say they never received, and which the company say was delivered to the representatives of the committee, to whom it was addressed. This is only a portion of the troubles. The desperation to which the city has been reduced by recent acts of lawlessness was indicated by the fact that more than 5000 revolvers had been purchased by citizens during one week. President Wheeler of the University of California, in a public address, said that feeling had been brought to such a point that if violence should be done to any of the reform chiefs, he believed public indignation would not stop short of death to the perpetrator. Woodstock's handsome contribution to the relief was acknowledged in the name of reliable parties and there is no reason to suppose that it was not applied to its destined purpose. It is said that in the aggregate the stealings will amount to a million dollars. It would be gratifying to hear better news.

JAILS NOT NEEDED.

A peculiar problem is being discussed in the Province of Prince Edward Island. The suggestion has been made that one jail centrally situated is ample to meet all the needs.

The plan heretofore has been a jail in each county, but oftentimes it has happened that all of them have been empty, and it never happens that any of them are full. The Charlottetown Guardian points out that the percentage of population, that is criminal, is the smallest in Prince Edward Island of any Province of Canada, and therefore there is no need for a prison in each county.

Recently the jail at Summerside was burned down. In one of the other counties the building is in a dilapidated condition. It is not likely therefore that either of these will be rebuilt, but one prison will serve all the needs of the Province.

This a striking tribute to the benefits of the prohibitory law. If bar-room accommodation is increased prison accommodation must also be increased. Where bar-room accommodation is reduced prisons become less necessary.

In Prince Edward Island there are no bar-rooms, and therefore no prisoners for the jails.

IN POLITICAL CIRCLES

An official count is necessary to determine who was elected lieutenant governor in New York State.

Bryan is pleased with the election results, which, he says, indicate a trend in favor of the Democratic party. He is disappointed in the Democratic gains in Congress but says they are sufficient to make it probable that the Democrats will control the Congress to be elected in 1908. "The popular vote, as indicated by the Congressional elections

shows that the Republicans even now have a narrow margin to go on," says Mr. Bryan, "and that margin will be quickly wiped out if the President allows himself to be drawn into a race for a third term."

With only three small towns to be heard from, all of which voted no license two years ago the returns from the State election show that five cities and 45 towns in New Hampshire voted to grant licenses for the sale of liquor while the remaining six cities and 176 towns voted against license. In May, 1903,

the last time the cities voted on the question all went for license. When the towns last cast their ballots on this matter in November, 1904, fifty went for license and 172 for no license. Of the eleven largest towns in the state outside the cities, two Claremont and Farmington voted for no license. There were only three changes from the vote of two years ago among these eleven towns, Claremont shifting from no license to license and Wolfeborough and Haverhill from license to no license.
