ST STEPHEN, N. B., Nov. 30.—A fatal gunning accident took place at Waweg yesterday, by which Otis Bell, aged seventeen years, was killed. Bell and Giles Hartford separated from the others of a hunting party and after going some distance they became confused as to the locality and the position of the settlement. Differing as to their position, Hartford told Bell he would climb a tree and ascertain correctly, but the young fellow requested that he be allowed as he was the younger. Bell stood his rifle against a tree and went to another about fourteen feet away from where the gun stood.

This tree he climbed for about twenty feet when in some unaccountable manner the gun was discharged. Bell fell to the ground and his companion thought the boy was frightened at the report of the gun. As he did not arise he went to his side and was horrified to find him in death throes passing away in a few minutes. The deceased was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Bell, who are grief stricken over the death of their boy. The community are very sympathetic, as the boy was popular, but none feels the sad affair so keenly as Mr. Hartford, who was with young Bell.

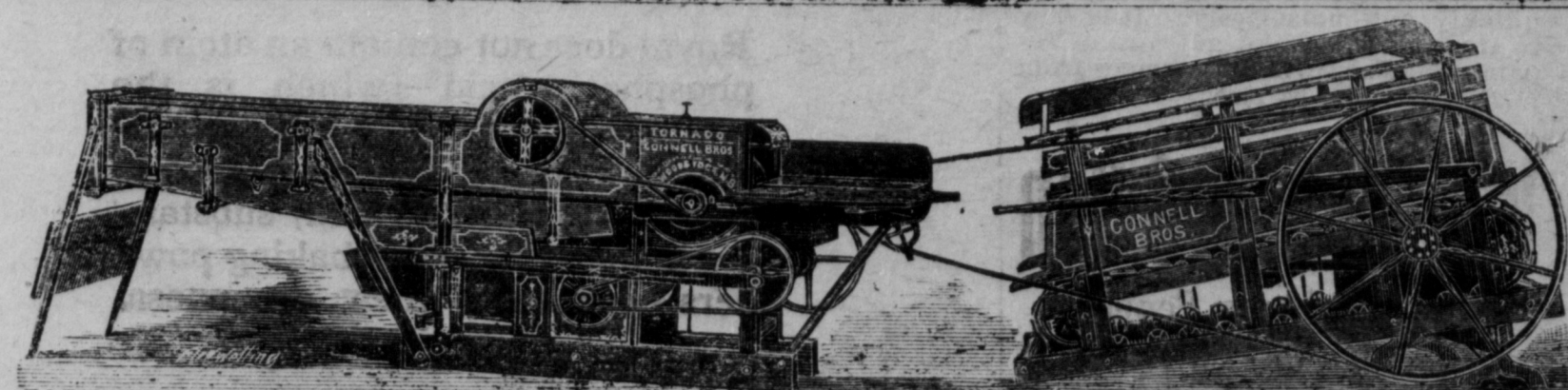

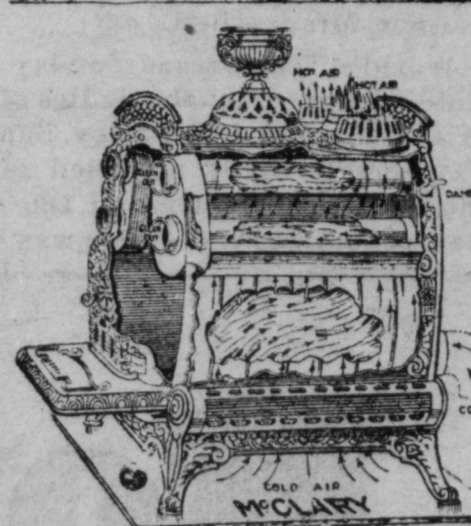
