SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST
HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion
Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Al-
berta, excepting 5 and 25, not reserved, may
be homesteaded by any person who is the
sole head of a family, or any male over 18
years of age, to the extent of one-quarter
section of 160 acres, more or less.
Entry must be made personally at the local
and office for the district in which the land
is situated.
The homesteader is required to perform the
conditions connected therewith under one of
the following plans:
(1) At least six months' residence upon and
cultivation of the land in each year for three
years.
(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is
deceased) of the homesteader resides upon a
farm in the vicinity of the land entered for,
the requirements as to residence may be
satisfied by such persons residing with the
father or mother.
(3) If the settler has his permanent residence
upon farming land owned by him in the
vicinity of his homestead, the requirements
as to residence may be satisfied by residence
upon the said land.
Six months' notice in writing should be
given to the Commissioner of Dominion
Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for
patent.

A statistical paper on India, lately
published in London, makes the
statement that during 1904 the total
number of persons killed by wild
beasts in India was twenty-four thou-
sand and thirty-four, of whom nearly
twenty-two thousand fell victims to
snakes. Tigers killed nearly eight
hundred, and leopards nearly four
hundred. On the other side of the
account are sixty-five thousand
snakes killed and sixteen thousand
other wild animals. To many per-
sons it may seem strange that a coun-
try so old as India should still har-
bor so many wild beasts, and that
they should be permitted to commit
such depredations. It must be re-
membered, is the admonition of
Youth's Companion, that the coun-
try is of vast extent, much of it still
covered with dense jungle; and that
religious scruples prevent many of
the inhabitants from taking the life
of any animal, hence general meas-
ures of extermination receive little
native support.

make it convenient to do so to at-
tend at Berryman's Hall, in the City
of St. John, on Thursday evening,
27th December next, at 7.30 o'clock.

This invitation is extended to all
Liberals in New Brunswick who are
interested in the success of the party
and the good government of the
country; but I would especially ask
the Liberal Associations and Liberal
Clubs of the various counties
throughout the Province to select
delegates who shall be authorized to
represent them at the convention.

There are many matters of impor-
tance to be considered, and it is
therefore my earnest wish to have at
the convention as many as possible
of those who take a real interest in
the advancement of Liberalism.

Thursday evening will be devoted
to the selection of a Nominating
Committee and the arranging of pre-
liminaries. It is probable that an
opportunity will also be afforded for
short addresses from representatives
of the different counties.

The convention will re-assemble
on Friday at 10 o'clock in the fore-
noon for the transaction of the real
business of the gathering. The day
will be given up wholly to the work
of organization, which it is hoped
will be completed in time to permit
the delegates to return to their
homes in the evening.

That the German naval authorities
have decided on the use of turbine
engines in the construction of war
vessels, "as much as possible,"
which, doubtless, means commonly,
indicates that this form of engine
has conquered the objections made
to it. The two disadvantages named
by the Secretary of the German
Navy Department—that vessels hav-
ing this type of engines cannot be
stopped so promptly as others, and
that they cost nearly double in the
first instance—appear to be regarded
as less important than the demon-
strated advantages. The experience
with great ocean steamers and with
the new British battleship, Dread-
nought, seems to have been accepted
as conclusive, and German naval
engineers rank with the best in the
world. The United States Navy
Department has not yet adopted the
turbine, although the Boston Herald
believes that the designs for the new
monster authorized by Congress
will leave the question of the kind
of engines for its motor power an
open one, or at least will present
the alternative to the consideration
of Congress. The reciprocating en-
gine for vessels seems likely to go
out of fashion ere long.
