Attorney-General Pugsley Shatters Opposition Arguments.

In his masterly defence of the administration during the Budget Debate Hon Wm Pugsley wiped the floor with the whole opposition.

He said: Last evening I was speaking of the statements made by members of this house and circulated by the opposition press that I had received large amounts of public money improperly during the past five years. It was said that from 1901 to 1905 I had been paid by the government upwards of \$42,000. I showed that these statements were entirely without foundation and any gentleman who chooses to examine the public accounts can see that these statements are wild and absurd.

As it is the duty of the government to give accurate information in regard to all public matters, so it is the duty of the opposition to make truthful criticisms and not disseminate false information. No parliamentary language that can be used in this house is strong enough to describe a man who circulates statements in regard to a political opponent which he knows to be false but if a man outside of the walls of this house said such things I would characterize him as a liar and if he persisted in his statement when shown the truth I would brand him as a wilful and malicious liar.

The men who have made these statements so unjustifiable and so injurious to me should have had in mind the lines of that great genius, Shakespeare, when he says: "Who steals my purse steals trash. 'Tis something, nothing; 'tis mine, 'tis his, and has been slave to thousands; but he who filches from me my good name robs me of that which not enriching him, doth make me poor indeed."

HOT SHOT FOR OPPOSITION.

Many of the gentlemen who have made these charges attend their churches Sunday after Sunday and hear there recited the divine command, "Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor," yet they go on from day to day repeating these false statements.

An examination of the reports of the auditor-general will show that apart from the case taken before the judicial committee of the privy council, the contingencies of my office, not one dollar of which came to my hands, my traveling expenses, which go to railways and hotels, my salary and sessional indemnity, I have only received \$5,550 from the public funds of the province during the past five years. And yet in the face of these facts, gentlemen opposite seek to convey the impression that I have been robbing the treasury. I ask now if there is anything to justify such statements. If the leader of the opposition will rise in his seat and say that the charges I have made are excessive, let him accept the offer I made last evening and refer them to any three eminent barristers. I repeat that I will pay all expenses in connection with the inquiry, I will give a bond to return to the province any money which they will say was improperly paid; may more than that, if they should determine that my charges were excessive, I will resign my seat in the executive and will leave to others the work that I have been doing. Now, as the legal gentleman from Charlotte who sits opposite has been making a list of payments to me which he says were improperly made, I ask him to read them over.

Mr Grimmer here rose and read the following paper:—

1904—Salary, \$2,100; travelling expenses, \$400; sessional indemnity, \$540; settling succession duties, \$544, 15; counsel fees, etc, \$4,579, 01; one-fifth commissioners provincial hospital, \$115; total, \$10,284, 06.
1905—Traveling expenses, \$775; salary, \$2,100; sessional indemnity, \$540; settling succession duties, \$532; counsel fees, etc, \$4, 625; Sunday legislation, \$200; additional fees paid since end of the year for settling succession duties of 1905, \$2,811, 49; one-sixth commissioners provincial hospital, \$98; total, \$11,674, 49.
Summary—1901, \$5,294, 57; 1902, \$8, 671; 1903, \$6,960, 02; 1904, \$10,284, 06; 1905, \$11,674, 49; total, \$43,084, 14. Average for five years, \$8,616.

UNFAIR TACTICS.

Hon Mr Pugsley: He now mentions for the first time the sums I received for my services in connection with the eastern extension claims. I was not aware that these services were included in his list, for they were performed long before 1902, most of them before I became a member of the government. There has never been a question as to the amount I received for my services in this matter. I may ask here also what fairness is there in including an amount paid on account of succession duties in 1906 to the amount of 1905? He has also included in the amount charged to me in 1901 the sum of \$648 for succession duties which I did not receive at all, that sum being paid to Messrs. White and Emerson before I became attorney-general. He also includes an item of \$500 in the case of Dunn vs the King, of which sum \$350 was paid to Mr White for professional services, although the warrant was made out in my name. He also includes among the charges on account of the case before the privy council the sum of \$1,041 paid to Field, Riscoe & Co, of London, for their services as solicitors.

Now the questions to be answered in connection with these charges are two in number. First, was it right that this work should be done? and second, were the amounts charged for doing this work excessive? First, let me take the representation case—ought or ought not the government to have undertaken that appeal to the privy council? The question was discussed in the legislature, and I think the general opinion was that the case should be taken up. We had entered into confederation under certain terms with regard to representation which we thought applied only to the four original provinces of the dominion, and my colleagues felt, with me that when the result of the last census was to deprive us of one of our representatives, the time had come to do something to prevent ourselves being swamped by the new and rapidly growing provinces of the west. It was therefore determined to have a test case, and the whole house concurred in the view. The people of the province also concurred.

SACRIFICED BUSINESS.

The premier will bear me out in saying that I did not wish to go to London to argue this case. I urged him to employ other counsel. I felt that it would not pay me to leave my business so long. But the premier insisted that I should go, and I went. Will any one say that I should be paid nothing for services that rendered it necessary for me to cross the Atlantic and took me so long from my own private practice?




