OUBA IN WINTER.

(By our Special Correspondent.)

A feeling naturally steals over one living in the Canadian North at the approach of every winter that if the rigors of that season could be escaped a new charm would be added to life. With some this thought is intensified with age. Not all the snows and frost can dissipate the dreams of roses, and the fruit and balmy air of an ageless summer-time and an opportunity for a visit to the south in winter is soldom missed.

Your correspondent is one of those who has had the happy privilege of a visit to Cuba in mid-winter and inasmuch as this Island is so much in evidence to-day, his impressions of its life and prevailing conditions may prove of interest to the readers of the SENTINEL.

In the first place the journey to Cuba is one of the pleasantest. It is much easier and far more full of interest than an "all rail" journey, and the expense of it is not comparatively great. To New York by rail, in twenty hours you realize that you are upon the Havana boat steaming out towards the summer seas. Probably the most comfortable and direct line of steamers are those of the Ward Line. Upon them a first class ticket to Havana is forty dollars. Although I had written a week before to secure the reservation of a stateroom on one of these boats, upon arrival in New York I learned that the travel was so great that for several sailings there was no 1st class accommodation. One could have gone by the Munson Line to Nuevitus but wishing to sail to Havana I took a steamer of the Mallory Line sailing to Galveston, Texas, changing to another steamer at Key West. It required an extra day to reach Havana and the ticket is the same. It was a delightful voyage. Pleasant and summer seas indeed they were. After the first day we could sit upon the decks with the thinnest summer clothing without outside coats. For a day we skirted the coast of Florida. We had an afternoon in Key West. To the public this is a place of interest for its fortifications and cigar manufactury. To me its interest was somewhat centered in its bananas and palms which were the first I had ever seen. Seven large turtle were lined upon the wharf, averaging upwards of 160 lbs in weight, doomed to the soup pots of Miami. The value of each to the owner in Key West was about \$20.

We crossed the Straits of Florida at night in a steamer named the 'Muscottee". It was just daylight as we passed through the narrow entrance to Havana harbor close at the base of "Morro" and the inner fortifications. There above an elevation of probably 200 feet of solid rock, rose the high sullen silent walls of the outer ramparts. Over the ominous mountain of masonry into the far distance stretched the beautiful field, clothed with the thick verdure of a Tropical Island, and thickly studded with palms. On the right a mile or more away stretched the city of Havana. The first impression is that it is a clean and busy city. In the inner harbour is the wrecked "Maine." Two masts and a heap of twisted iron show above the water. Sailing within fifty feet of this we anchored and waited the arrival of the doctor and customs' officer. Havana has docks. At present it would defeat a government to propose their erection. After a long delay we were transferred to a small steamer and landed at Machinery Wharf. It is Spain; it sounds like Spain; it looks like Spain; it smells like Spain.


