Few more picturesque figures can ever have visited New Brunswick in the days when the British army kept regiments stationed at St John than William Cobbett, sergeant-major of his Majesty's 6th Regiment of Foot, afterwards a famous pamphleteer, author of some one hundred and thirty works, a defender of Queen Caroline, and altogether a man of prodigious energy. Mr S D Scott, until recently editor of The St John Sun, and one of the best known Canadian journalists, made an excellent choice when he selected Cobbett for the subject of a paper to be read before the New Brunswick Historical Society. His historical study now appears in book form. Cobbett spent six years in New Brunswick, principally at St John. Here he met a soldier's daughter, and made so sure of her admirable character, although she was but thirteen, that he "never had a thought of her being the wife of any other man." Years afterwards Miss Mitford praised Mrs Cobbett as the realization of one of Sir Walter Scott's most charming characters. "William Cobbett in New Brunswick" is a spirited, entertaining and graceful chapter of Canadian historical literature.

**ENA'S AWFUL OATH.**  
(Toronto News.)

The English mail just to hand brings the text of the oath of abjuration of Protestantism which the Roman Catholic Church insisted upon Princess Ena of Batterberg taking upon her entrance into the Roman Catholic Church. It reads as follows:

"I, recognizing as true the Catholic and apostolic faith, do here publicly anathematize every heresy, especially that to which hitherto I have had the misfortune to belong. I agree with the holy Roman Church, and profess with mouth and heart my belief in the apostolic see, and my adhesion to that faith which the holy Roman Church, by evangelical and apostolic authority, delivers to be held. Swearing this by the sacred Homosian, or trinity of the same substance, and by holy gospels of Christ, I do pronounce those worthy of eternal anathema who oppose this faith with their dogmas and their followers, and should I myself at any time presume to approve or proclaim anything contrary hereto, I will subject myself to the severity of the Canon law. So help me God, and these His holy gospels."

That King Edward the official head of the Church of England should have consented to his niece paying such a price for the attainment of a Queen's title, seems beyond comprehension. Is there any wonder that the Protestants of the Empire are dismayed? Or that the enemies of the Church of England find their hands strengthened with a weapon which will aid the demand for the disestablishment of the State Church? If a girl brought up in the Protestant faith by prelates of the Church of England can so easily condemn all her relatives and all the "heretics" of the British realm

to eternal damnation with such light heartedness, what hold can the Church have upon the masses?

(In Great Britain there has been a lot of trouble over Princess Ena's change of faith. In this country people do not go crazy over such affairs. The young princess is the custodian of her own conscience. She alone must profit or suffer by her renunciation of protestantism. No one else need worry.)
