Mr. Carvell Speaks for the Chris tian Sabbath.

(Extract from Hansard.)

Mr Carvell. I have voted against the amendment of the hon member for Labelle (Mr Bourassa) and I think I am bound to vote against the

amendment proposed by the hon Minister of Finance (Mr Fielding). I do this because, in the first place, I want to be logical, and in the second place, in so far as I am concerned, I want to see one Sabbath in Canada and one only. I say in the first place I want to be logical. I cannot see any reason why the Jew should have the right to run his shop-I was almost going to say sweat shop - in the city of Montreal or some other portion of Canada. whereas the Seventhday Adventist who, I believe, is honest and conscientious and so far ahead of the Jew that he ought not to be mentioned in the same class, is prohibited from working in the field on Sunday. It is not logical to allow one class of people to work on Sunday and to prohibit another class. In so far as I am concerned I say that both should be prohibited. There is only room in this country for one Sabbath. Hon members have said that this is a hardship. I am not going to attempt to go into discussion of this question because it has been discussed so thoroughly that there is nothing left to be said.

We have had practically the same law in New Brunswick for many years and in the province of Ontario there has been a valid law up to two years ago and the Jews and Seventhday Adventists of these provinces have not suffered any very great hardship. There has been a great amount of common sense displayed in handling these people in the past and there will be a great amount of common sense displayed if these privileges are not given to thse peo-

Barnum & Bailey Continue Success ful Experiment of Eliminating Street Pageants.

A circus that is "too big to give a street parade" is a novelty even in these days of colossal enterprises and mammoth amusement institutions. But that is the announcement of the Barnum & Bailey circus, which exhibits in Woodstock on Saturday, 28th inst.

TOO BIG TO PARADE.

In speaking of the reasons for this striking innovation, a representative of the big show, said recently : "The Barnum & Bailey circus has become so large that a parade is no longer possible or even desirable. If we could be absolutely sure of getting into town by daybreak, the parade would still be feasible, but with our five long trains of cars, this is too much to expect of the railroad companies. In many instances it is 8 or 9 o'clock before the last section arrives, and 10 o'clock before it is unloaded and the paraphernalia transferred to the show grounds. This leaves just sufficient time to erect the big tents and prepare for the afternoon performance. To take several hundred men away from the show grounds at the most critical time in the morning, in order to give a parade, would mean delay in opening, and consequent discomfort to the public. To compel thousands of people to stand out in front of the entrance in the hot sun or rain, because the giving of the parade has delayed the opening for an hour or more, is positively cruel; but there is frequently no help for it when parades are given. By elimi-

nating the parade the public is also saved a long and often uncomfortable wait on the streets pending the always more or less delayed procession, which at best has nothing new to offer, to say nothing of
