Mr Whitehead for York.

The Liberals of the County of York are to be congratulated upon the nomination of Mr W Turner Whitehead M P P as their federal candidate. He is a gentleman who is well-known throughout the length and breadth of the constituency, and we feel quite safe in predicting his election. The party in York may easily redeem that fine county if a united stand be made against the common enemy. The work will be less difficult than formerly by reason of the disintegration in the ranks of the Conservatives, caused by the fact that the York Opposition party is now practically controlled by a couple of families, that is to say, in so far as the dog can ever be wagged by the tail.

Political Dead Weights.

The recent activity of Hon George E Foster, whose connection with the western land deals, which were financed through the Union Trust Company with the funds of the For-esters has been severely condemned by practically all the independent and several of the thorough-going Opposition press, has naturally evoked critical comment. The Montreal Herald thinks that while Mr Foster is to be admired, in a way, for the pertinacity he shows his ignoring of the feeling against his continued participation in the leadership of the party can hardly be said to have destroyed that feeling.

Those, says the Herald, who sincerely agreed with the Ottawa Journal and the Montreal Star when they pronounced his usefulness in Parliament to be at an end can hardly be supposed to have changed their minds just because Mr Foster himself declines to share their opinion. The explanation of his continued activity and their presumed acquiescence no doubt is that there is not at present any one upon whom favorable opinion could be centred to the point of creating a demand for his appearance in different parts of the country, and as Mr Foster has certain undeniable platform gifts his appearances are no doubt tolerated with what grace can be mastered.

What Mr Borden will eventually do, in view of his pledge to form a Cabinet of men to whom no exception would be taken, is not quite clear. As the Herald says, "when Mr Foster's position was challenged from the audience at one of Mr Borden's Manitoba meetings, the most Mr Borden could be got to say was that there was nothing proved against Mr Foster in his public capacity, a manifest evasion of the issues raised by the report of the Insurance Commission. Of course no exception need be taken by Liberals if Ontario Conservatives choose to cleave to Mr Foster in spite of everything, just as Liberals here about need not worry, from the standpoint of party tactics, if Mr Pope is still able to impose his authority upon the Conservatives of the Townships."
