**Cromer Milner.**

Seldom has the stock of British statesmen of the first rank run dry. The return of Lord Cromer and Lord Milner to political life in England is an event of consequence. They are valuable recruits to an Opposition which, in the general election, was injured both in quality of leadership and in the number of men available for the highest service. Lord Cromer's career in Egypt is one of those wonderful illustrations of the way in which the character and genius of an individual preserve the force and vitality of the Empire abroad. Lord Milner found in South Africa a task that would have crushed a weak man. Tried in the crucible of vehement party attack, he emerged from a critical situation the one civilian whose fame was enhanced by the painful experiences of the reconstruction period. His policy has been arraigned by his enemies; his statesmanship no one doubts.

There has been times when, in two respects British Parliamentary life has seemed to fail in producing what the nation needs. During the American War there was a lack of men, and both then, and on occasions since, the politicians appear to miss the art of gaining public confidence. This is but another way of saying that to govern Great Britain strongly her statesmen must possess ability of a high order, and that their motives and integrity must be above question. Lord Salisbury, who had the great advantage of serving in both branches of the Legislature, and of having preceded this experience by a period of observation of public affairs as student and journalist, has declared that no blindness is so unaccountable as the blindness of British statesmen to the political value of a character. Disraeli said in his clever way that England did not love coalitions; that is a union of place-seeking politicians. There may be apparent apathy for a time. But the British electorate is, to a great extent, a thinking organism, and can act in emergencies with a clear insight and with emphasis. The value, therefore, of Lord Cromer and Lord Milner now is that they justly enjoy a reputation for unselfishness, purity and a devotion to duty which will stand them in good stead with the English people.

**WILL KISSING BE PROHIBITED**

**The Farmer.**

There is but one person whose welfare is as vital to the welfare of the whole country as is that of the wage-worker who does manual labor; and that is the tiller of the soil—the farmer. If there is one lesson taught by history, it is that the permanent greatness of any State must ultimately depend more upon the character of its country population than upon anything else. No growth of cities, no growth of wealth, can make up for a loss in either the number or the character of farming population. When this nation began its independent existence, it was as a nation of farmers. The towns were small, and were for the most part sea-coast, trading, and fishing ports. The chief industry of the country was agriculture, and the ordinary citizen was in some way connected with it. In every great crisis of the past a peculiar dependence has had to be placed upon the farming population; and this dependence has hitherto been justified. But it cannot be justified in the future if agriculture is permitted to sink in the scale as compared with other employments. We cannot afford to lose that pre-eminently typical American, the farmer who owns his own farm.—President Roosevelt.
