SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS. Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the application at a Dominion Lands Agency or Subagency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an Agency on mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.
(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less Cition, Orange and Lemon Peel.

than eighty (80) acres in extent in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this 3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less

than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or (4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as

meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowance crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such inten-

Six months' notice in writing must be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of intention to apply for patent.




