President Roosevelt has announced his adhesion to the self-denying declaration made by him on the night of his election three years ago. That means of course that he will not be a candidate for a third term and it leaves the numerous aspirants after the successorship to fight for the Republican nomination without the latent dread that some unexpect ed ebullition of public sentiment might sweep them all aside in fivor of the present executive head of the state. This will be specially pleasing to the high finance section of the Republican party, who have watched with intense dislike the progress of the president's campaign against trusts and monopolies of all kinds. Were they not controlled by the manifest popularity of Mr Roosevelt's policy throughout all parts of the United States, their efforts after the securing of a party candidate of very different character would be more open and avowed. And the main interest in the struggle within the Republican party for the official nomination will be the manoeuvres for and against the selection of a candidate who will continue the Roosevelt policy and traditions. sident will no doubt take an important share. He is credited with being an astute political worker and very anxious to be succeeded by one who will adopt his policies and carry them out. Contrariwise those Republican money magnates who regard them as mainly responsible for the financial crisis are no less determined to replace Mr Reosevelt by a president less strenuously insistent on the rights of the people and more amenable to capitalistic influence. In the present temper of the people, however, they will scarcely dare to put forward a candidate too avowedly on the side of the monopolistic combinations. If the precedent set at the last gubernatorial election for the State of New York may be taken as a guide, the Republican nominee; if this reactionary section has its way, will be strong with the people and at the same time of distinctly conservative tendency. Probably only a candidate of the type of Governor Hughes would have defeated William Randolph Hearst in New York State, and there are many indica tions that the people of the United States generally will not submit to further exploitation by trusts, combinations and public service corpor-
