Rules for Repairing Roads.

Principles of importance in the repair of roads are.

(1) Use the same material in the repair of roads as was used in construction.

(2) When square shoulders gravel or stone roads, they should be cut away with a grader, turning this material outward-never drawit to the centre of the road.

(3) Never allow hollows, ruts or puddles to remain on the road, but fill them at once; if an earth road, use earth; if a gravel road use gravel; if a stone road, use stone.

(4) Deep holes in gravel and stone roads should have the earth and for Mount Hope, a land of flowers. soft material cleaned out of them before putting in new metal.

(5) Ruts and holes should be filled a little above the surface of the road so that there will not be a depression when the material is consolidated.

(6) Loose stones should be raked into piles, to be taken up by a wagon and hauled away. This stone should be collected in a convenient place to be used afterward for crushing, putting into fills, or in such other manner as occasion may require. (7) It is especially necessary that
