The Independents are :- In Quebec Mr Armand Lavergne and Mr Rob-The vacancies are:-In Quebec, Labelle and Nicolet, the former held by a Liberal turned Independent, Mr Bourassa, and the latter by a Liberal, Mr CR Devlin; in Ontario, Ottawa and Centre York, both held by Liberals. The elections for the Ontario vacancies take place on December 23rd. Should Liberals be elected.in all four, the standing will be: Liberals, 138; Conservatives, 73; Independents, 3; total, 214. As compared with last session, this session opens with a gain of two for the Conservatives: Colchester and London have elected Conservatives in place of Liberals. On the other hand, the resignation of Mr Bourassa removes a formidable critic of the Government. The Liberal party is still strongly handled by Sir Wilfrid Laurier, His nominal first lieutenant is Mr Field; for the last two sessions, however, the most powerful real help received by the Prime committeee of Chosen Friends at Minister has been given by Mr Sifton, who ceased to be a Minister in 1905.
