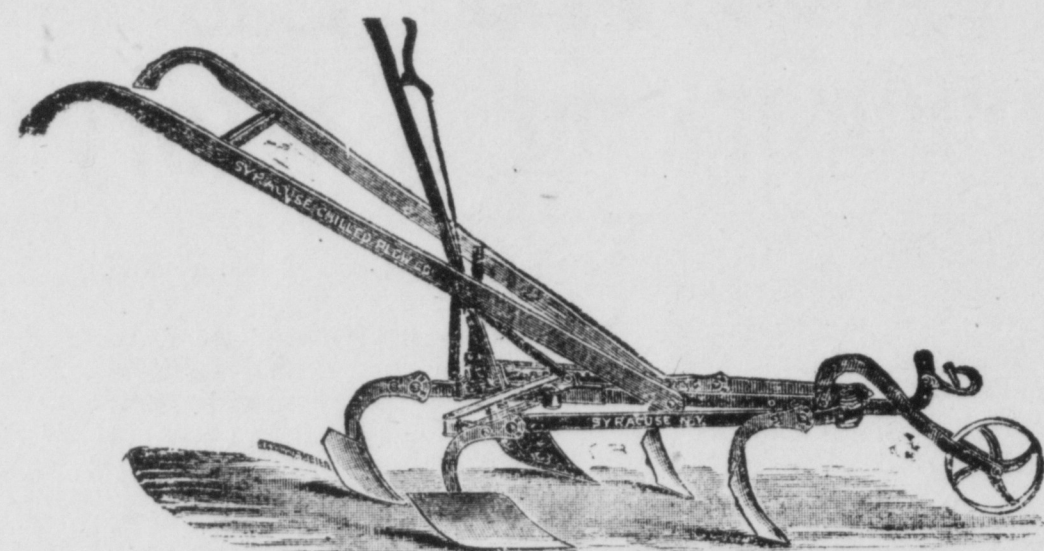

Canada's Dignity Sustained.

The visit of Sir Wilfrid Laurier to London, in connection with the Colonial Conference, has brought down attacks from many envious persons and periodicals. They seek occasion in the incident to charge the Prime Minister with a desire to glorify himself at the expense of Canada. Such a charge is more than ridiculous, it is insane. Sir Wilfrid upon every occasion, both in his personal conduct and attitude on public questions, has attracted dignity to the great country whose representative he is. In dealing with affairs involving Canadian politics, he has invariably kept aloof from expressing any opinion which might be interpreted as an interference with British domestic politics. His attitude throughout a very trying ordeal has been that of a statesman thoroughly alive to his responsibilities, and conscious of the dignity of his own position. Sir Wilfrid Laurier emerges from the conference looking larger in public affairs than when he entered it. He has gained in personal prestige, Canada is better known, and respected in proportion, and will ultimately be the beneficiary of all the good that Sir Wilfrid accomplished on that occasion.

Japan and United States.

It is very doubtful if there is any real basis for the frequent publication of reports from Japan of ill-will towards the United States and the consequent possibility of war between the two countries. That the school difficulty at San Francisco, and the recent attack on a Japanese restaurant in the same city, have irritated the Japanese is true enough, but the government and the people of intelligence generally know that these are local affairs for which the people of the United States cannot be held responsible. Of the friendliness of the United States they can have no doubt, and it is evident the authorities at Washington are doing all they can to relieve the situation. President Roosevelt is particularly anxious to remove all grounds of trouble, and Japan has been assured that justice will be done when the San Francisco trouble is fully investigated. A difficulty, of course, is that California may not be disposed to meet the wishes of the national government, and thus a serious situation may be created. The Japanese, in their new and proud position among the great powers of the world, demand to be treated with fair play and with respect, and therefore insist upon more consideration than has been given them. That they desire to go to war with the United States is far from likely even though they are desirous of obtaining possession of the Philippines and Hawaii. The war correspondents tell of the organization of Japanese in the islands, expecting hostilities to break out, but the news is of the sensational type, and is not likely to be verified. Japan and the United States will hardly go to war over the damage done to a restaurant in San Francisco. —St John Globe.
