### E. M. Edwards of White Sulphur Springs Passes Away.

Word was received in the city yesterday of the death of E. M. Edwards, one of the oldest and best known residents of White Sulphur Springs. The cause of death could not be learned here. While Mr Edwards' health had not been the best for several years, it was not known that he was afflicted with any serious ailment. Mr Edwards was about 50 years of age. He was well known in Great Falls, where he and his family frequently visited.

The telegram announcing the death was received by Mrs Jane Barker, mother of Mrs Edwards.

Mr Edwards was of Scotch descent. He came to Montana 25 or 30 years ago, locating at Anaconda, where he engaged in mining, with considerable success. For several years, he operated the Blue-Eyed Nellie mine, taking from it a small fortune in silver ore.

In 1899, he married Miss Florence Barker, daughter of Mrs Jane Barker of this city, and sister to D. L. Barker and J. O. Barker, both of Great Falls. He is survived by his widow and two little daughters, aged 10 and 12 years, respectively.

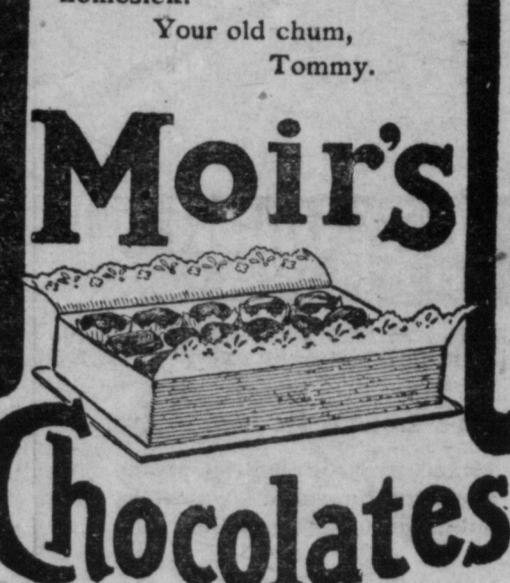
