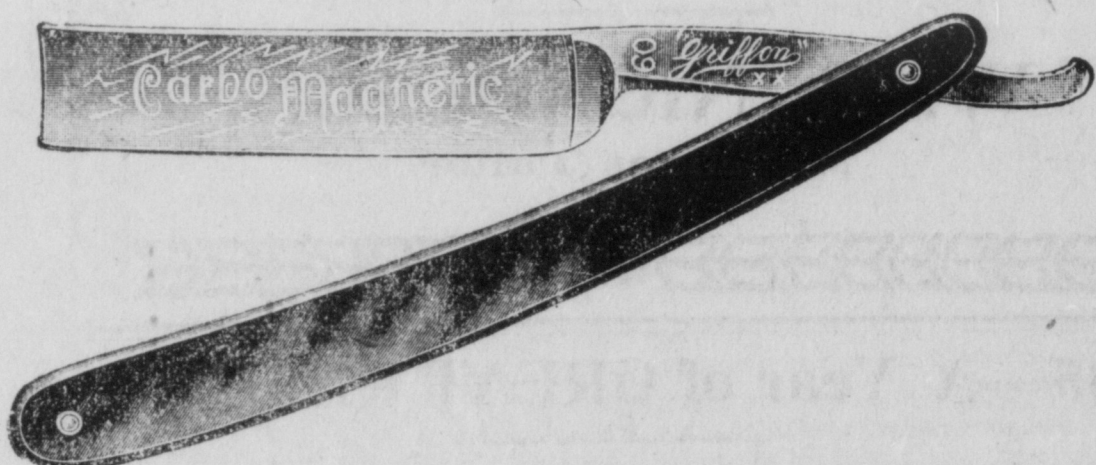

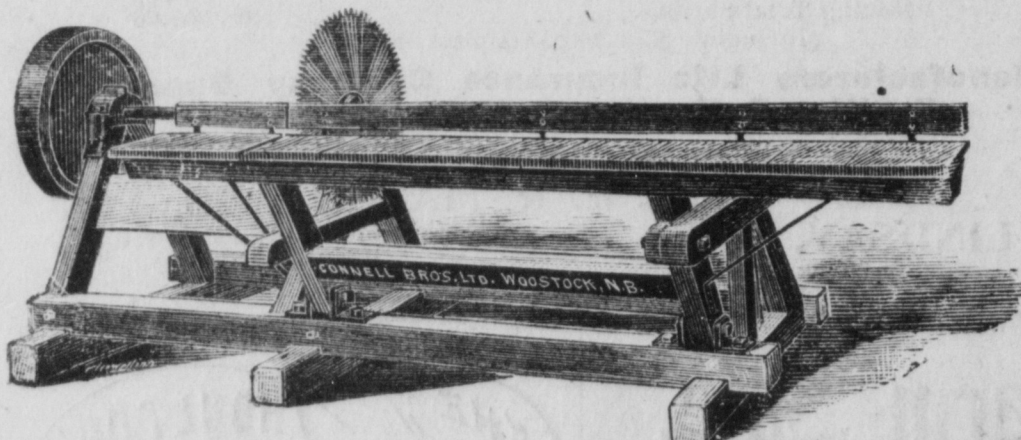

Mayor Munro remitted the above amount Monday afternoon, the Bank of Nova Scotia kindly undertaking to forward a draft for the full amount, without cost.

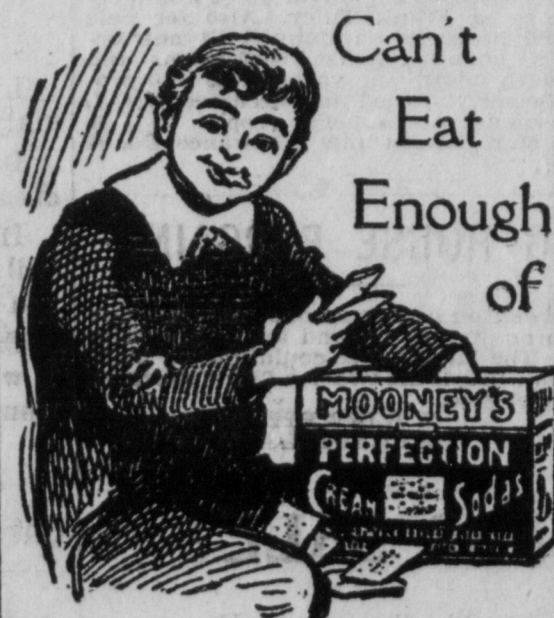

**Will Support the Government.**

A prominent up-river gentleman, who in federal politics has always been a rather pronounced conservative, writes us as follows:—

"Dear Sir,—I have been much interested in the course of the party to which I belong in connection with the matter of nominating the three candidates to oppose the government ticket. All I can say is that the two parties to my mind have put up very strong men, and it will be a hard close contest. I do not believe in so far as my parish is concerned there are many converts from either side. In this place three years ago there was very little between the two tickets, and my impression is there will be about as small a margin next time. I see by the resolution Conn Williams put through there will be no fault found with any conservative at least who votes on the ground of thinking for himself, not letting the leaders think for him. In the last fight I make bold to say I could not see my way clear to support Mr Jones and his ticket, but as the conservatives have made it so that I can honestly express my convictions in a tangible way at the polls and elsewhere without losing caste in the party to which in federal lines I have given forty years of service, I will say right here that I will if spared to cast a vote in the next contest, give my support to the Solicitor General, and I do not feel that I can do anything to oppose his ticket. As the conservatives have agreed to fight on mongrel lines I suppose they will not be too hard on me for jumping the traces. All I can say is that some one party should be responsible for the governing of the country. As my old party is apparently afraid to fight in the good old style that sent Fraser, Tilley and its giants of the past to victory, it will do them good to be left in the cold another term. In my opinion the Moncton platform was the best the party every had. If they had stuck to it instead of swapping horses in crossing the stream, it would be too much for me to swallow to vote even for Jones, much as I admire him, but having given me and others like me the privilege, wrongly as I contend, I may as well exercise it."
