THE OPPOSITION AND MR FOSTER.

The course of the Conservative Opposition at Ottawa, in relation to the Insurance Commission's indictment of Mr Foster, must have received little consideration before its adoption, or else the political instinct has been completely obscured by mistaken ideas of party loyalty. The defense of Mr Foster was a task too great for even a strong Government to undertake. No Government possessing political acumen would have attempted his defence in view of the findings and the published evidence of the Insurance Report. No Government could afford to undertake such a defence; much less could the Conservative Opposition, which has not even yet recovered from the debacle of 1896, and in which the process of coalescence is curiously slow.

It is quite true that Mr Foster on the one side and Senator Cox on the other side were within their rights in making statements of their positions and in defending themselves against the criticisms contained in the Insurance Report. It is open to serious question whether such defence could possibly have the desired effect on the public mind. Protests of innocence are of little use unless convincing proof is added.

Instead of letting the affair rest with Mr Foster's statement to the House, the Opposition rushed to the rescue of the ex-Finance Minister, and incidentally made a singularly bad job of it. But the task was an ungracious task, an impossible task. The vehement denunciation of the Insurance Commission by the same Opposition which insisted upon its appointment is a curious illustration of how partisan struggles obscure that clear political vision and presence which are necessary above all to an Opposition.

The speeches of the Opposition in the House of Commons denouncing the Commission and defending Mr Foster were singularly ineffective and unconvincing. They did not convince the House; they did not convince the Conservative party; and we are quite sure they did not convince the country. The result, however, has been to impose an added burden on the Conservative party—a burden which we believe the party will refuse to carry. It has left a too well-grounded suspicion that however censorious the Opposition may be of wrong doing or scandal on the Government side, it is not only content to harbor a political Achan in its own camp, but too ready to bluster that he is without blemish. Even less than a Government, can an Opposition afford to be lax in these things. If an Opposition denounces wrongdoing amongst its opponents and condones wrongdoing amongst its own members, the public grows more and more deaf to its arraignment of Government inefficiency or dishonesty, and more and more cynical as to its sincerity and honesty and strength of purpose.

Imagine what a commotion would have arisen had Hon Geo E Foster been a member of the Government. Would the Opposition have come to his defence, or would the Opposition orators have toured the country denouncing the cynical immorality of a Government which harbored a Minister whose notions of commercial honor were so beclouded?

In the last analysis it would have been sound policy and good politics to have recognized frankly that as an Opposition lieutenant, Mr Foster's usefulness was over. It would ultimately have strengthened Mr Borden's hand, and made him free to deal ruthlessly with Government wrongdoing. As it is, the Opposition is weakened in the country and there are signs that his own party in Mr Foster's present constituency will reverse the policy adopted by the Opposition at Ottawa. As an instance of bad politics and a fine opportunity lost through mere perverseness and partisan blindness the Opposition course in this connection has been unconvincing, inept, and disappointing. (Toronto News, Ind Cons.)
