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The New York Sun and Canada.

Recently an expatriated Canadian named W. R. Givens, a former resident of Kingston, Ont., wrote to The New York Independent, giving his opinion of the Dominion and its people. Now The New York Sun expresses surprise that anyone should be so ill-informed as Mr. Givens has shown himself to be with respect to conditions in this country. The Sun says editorially:

"With the statement of this writer that 'there is little real Canadianism in the Dominion, really no such thing as true Canadian spirit,' we cannot agree in any way. It does not accord with the facts. The federation of 1867 was the first decisive step in the march of a distinct sentiment of Canadian nationality, and on every later page of the history of the Dominion there is recorded the advance of that sentiment. There is still loyalty to England, as there should be so long as Canada remains even nominally a colony, but Canada's self-government is now virtually absolute, with the exception of treaty-making power and the inherent though infrequently exercised right of her citizens, as British subjects, to appeal from decisions of the Supreme Court to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council of Great Britain. These form only the slenderest of political ties and only a little strain would be needed to break them. Mr. Givens may be an exception, but it is our experience that Canadians as a whole are justly proud of Canada and of their political status as Canadians rather than British subjects, and that they believe in and strive for a Canada which is and shall be for Canadians.

Until recently Canada's growth proceeded at a very moderate pace, and there are to-day fewer people in the entire Dominion than there were in the United States a hundred years ago. Mr. Givens explains this by saying that the young men of Canada 'as soon as he is old enough properly to observe promptly shakes the dust of the country off his shoes and gets him to the United States, where a man may be a man before his Canadian time.' This was in some measure true twenty years ago and perhaps also ten years ago. We question its accuracy to day and believe that such a statement will be quite impossible ten years from now. Canada's development from the year 1763, when France ceded 'Canada with all its dependencies' to England, until the federation of 1867 was extremely slow. It was not much more rapid for the next thirty years. About ten years ago the country really began to come into its own, and no careful student of the last decade can deny its wholesome growth during that period or doubt its much more rapid and equally wholesome growth to come."

The Sun takes a sane view of conditions as they exist in this Dominion. Too often Canadians fail to distinguish between the spread eagles of the yellow papers and the sound conservative doctrine of the high class responsible American journals.

It will be observed that a considerable portion of the performers hail from Carleton County.

THE AGE OF NATIONS.

Turkey, Born in 1453, the Oldest of the Present Generation.

The ages of most countries are recorded as exactly as that of any individual, and many of the nations usually considered old, even ancient, were really born long after those we call the younger ones of the new world. The father of nations, as we know them, is Turkey, with the sultan seated at Constantinople since 1453.

Then comes Denmark, born in 1523, followed by Russia, born Oct 22, 1721, when Peter the Great became the first emperor. The United States of America, that most readers probably thought very young, was born July 4, 1776, and France, possibly imagined to be much older, counts from July 14, 1789.

Younger than either is the United Kingdom, born Jan 1, 1801. Chile was born Sept 18, 1810; Colombia on July 5, 1811; Holland, Dec 6, 1813 and Sweden starts from Feb 5, 1818.

Brazil dates from Sept 7, 1822; Mexico was born Oct 4, 1823, and Bolivia was born Aug 6, 1824. Belgium is younger, being born July 19, 1831, the same year as Ecuador and Venezuela. It may be a surprise to find Italy so youthful, her birth occurring Feb 28, 1861.—London Answers.




