Cow Testing Association.

In Ontario and Quebec they have instituted cow testing associations. The plan is copied from Denmark dairymen. The system is to test once a month or oftener the milk and milking qualities of the individual members of a herd. The returns are very interesting as showing how much better one cow in a herd. For instance, at Princeton, Ont., in a herd of 14 cows the test for 30 days gave for highest milk yield from one cow 600 lbs testing 38 and the lowest 380 lbs testing 17.

In a herd of 32 cows at Bagotville Ont., the highest individual yield for one cow for 30 days ending Oct 14, was 620 lbs testing 33 and the lowest 250 lbs testing 40. In another of 23 cows the highest yield for the same time was one giving 720 lbs of milk testing 30.9 and the lowest 410 lbs testing 4.6. This is a good herd—but the best was more than 60 per cent better than the poorest.

In a herd of 8 cows in Lothbriar, Que., the best gave in the same time a yield of 900 lbs of milk testing 43 and the lowest 500 lbs testing 41. These are good cows, but there is a big difference between the best and the poorest.

In a herd of 16 cows at St Edwidge, Que., for 30 days ending Oct 7, one cow gave 1190 lbs of milk testing 41 and the poorest 810 lbs testing 39. This is the best herd given in the latest return and apparently as good as may be expected to be got together anywhere.

The object is to find out the best and the poorest cows in a herd so that the dairymen would know which to keep and which to put away. In Denmark it is safe to state that every cow in a dairy herd is tested at least once a year. When the test began there was a great weeding out among the different herds. In Ontario and Quebec the tests, as far as applied, show that in many herds cows have been kept that did not pay their keep.

A STRANGE CARGO.

One of the strangest cargoes a vessel could possibly have was unloaded at the London docks in March last. It consisted of several sacks filled with dried flies, consigned to a large firm of grain merchants. These flies, originating in Brazil, have been purchased for use in the manufacture of food for chickens, cage birds, and the like. They were caught on the River Amazon by Brazilians, who travel up the river in flatbottomed boats, and who are provided with gauze nets, with which they capture these insects in millions as flies hover in dense clouds over many of the swampy reaches of the Amazon.

The flies thus caught are killed, dried in the sun, and then placed in sacks. Upon arrival in London they are mixed with millet and other grain, and are sold as chicken food, etc. Some time ago the Brazilian government, fearing that the fish in the Amazon River would be starved, forbade the exportation of flies.

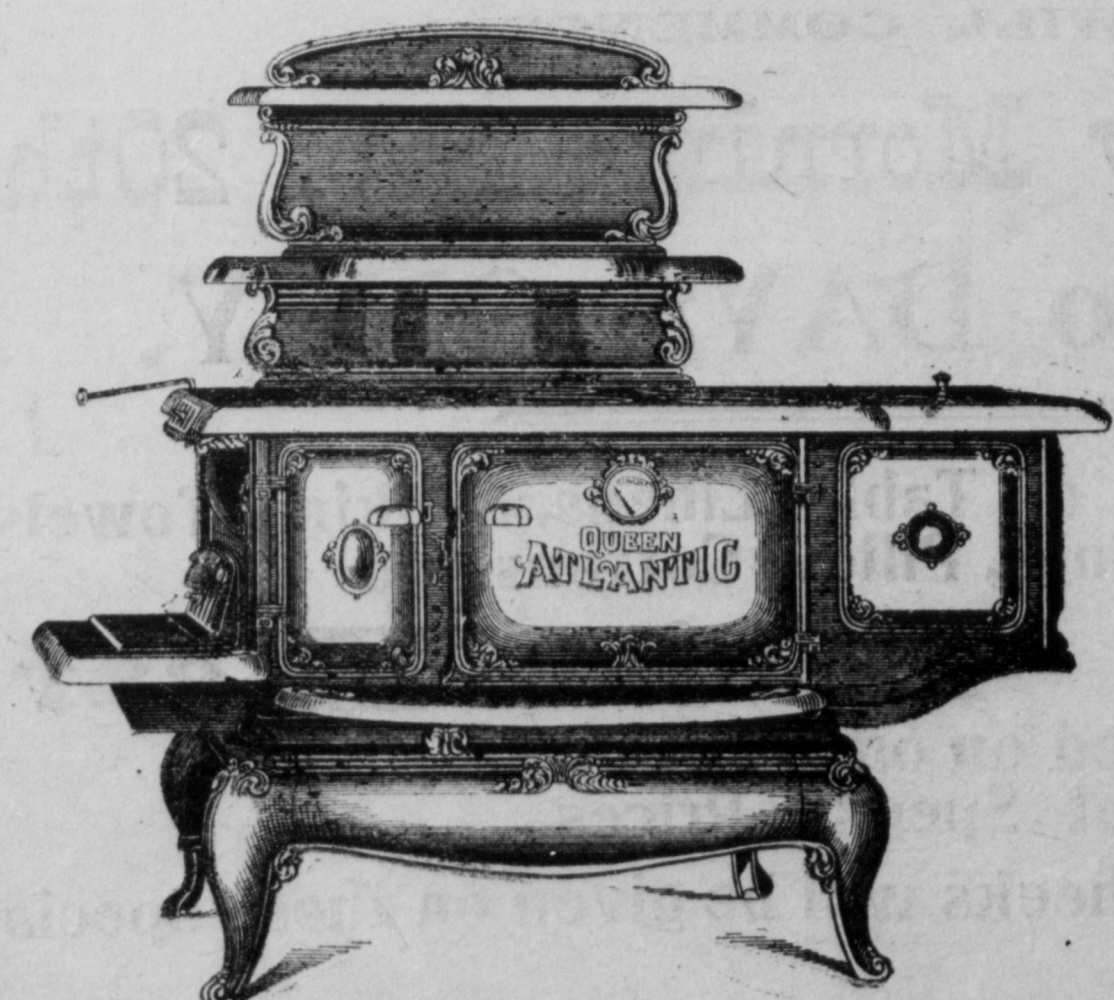
