Lieut Colonel D McLeod Vince occupied the chair. Seated beside him were Rev Dr W C Keirstead and Revs R G Fulton, G D Ireland and A Hastings Kearney. After a short song service, led by that gifted singer, Mr F L Mooers, and prayer by Elder Blakeney, the pleasure on the Sabbath. chairman called upon Elder Kearney

as the first speaker. Mr Kearney said the Sabbath was becoming too much like the so-called Continental observance in the Eastern Hemis-

phere. To him there seemed to be something in the number "seven." Even machinery does better work in the long run by resting one day in the week. He read the salient provisions of the new Lord's Day Act, and also extracts from a tract published by a preacher in U S. To his mind christians should not permit business or visitors to interfere with church attendance.

Rev Mr Fulton said the work of protecting the Sabbath is as old as tte world itself. Ever since Crea tion the day of rest has been a factor in life. He had heard the criticism that the reason the ministry agitates so much in favor of Sabbath obser vance is the fear of losing their sup port. It was part and parcel of the christian duty to guard the Sabbath. Some folks had accused the speaker of narrow spirit in opposing the suggested series of Sunday afternoon bnckler for her summer conquest. sacred Band Concerts, and on that account accused him of being a puri tan. He thanked God that there is vet some degree of puritanical feel ing, in order to keep the thin edge of the wedge of Sabbath desecration out of the moral fabric of the community. 


