It appears that a Chinese contractor, Lee Sun Sai, lured the Chinese on board the ship from the vicinity of Harbin on a promise to land them in San Francisco. When two days out he told them a mistake had been made, and the boat would land them at Guayamus, Mexico. On learning of this deception the Chinese broke out in mutiny, chased the officers of the ship into their cabius, attacked those of the Chinese crew who remained faithful and then started a race war on the Russians.

The officers finally fought their way out, and, after shooting a score of the Chinese, regained control of the ship. 
