Tennyson Smith.

The Apostle of Temperance has been conducting a campaign in Glace Bay. From a very full report printed in a Sydney paper, we clip the following paragraphs:—

Mr Smith, upon rising, said: I thank you for the many kind things you have said about myself. The reason why people come to hear me, what is it? I am only a man. I believe the reason is that I feel in my heart that God has given me a mission and a work to do, and that is why the people come to hear me. I am not saying I think so and so is correct, but anything I say it is said because I know it. I have authority to speak as I do, and that authority is my own experience. I speak what I know, not what I think. A man has not a right to an opinion on every question. He only has a right to the truth. There can not be any two opinions about the truth. Some people say there are two sides to everything. This applies to the saloon only in one way. There is the outside and inside. If I give a message from God the people reject it at their peril. I don't think it is best to be a total abstainer, but I know it is. I don't think it is wrong to sell intoxicating liquor, but I know it is.

I understand I am beginning to be criticized. Some people are very angry with me. You know that if you throw a stone among a pack of dogs, it is the hit cur that whines. Draw your own conclusion. I am prepared to prove every statement I make.

The Scott Act is disgracefully and shamefully mismanaged in this town. I have a definite charge to make against the liquor traffic. Listen to it: The liquor traffic, since its introduction, is the main cause of misery and poverty and crime, and is the greatest enemy of all that is good, pure and true. It is a mean, vile, despicable, diabolical, devilish, damnable business. (Hear, hear.) Will anyone deny this? Is it true? (Cries of "yes" from all over the house.)

Now, you liquor men, if you have the courage of mice, and have anything to say for your vile, dirty trade, let me hear from you. Don't wait until I leave town, but if you are not too cowardly and have the courage of a mouse, defend your dirty business now, while I am here. I am not going to answer questions on the street. I will answer right here from this platform, so that more than one person will get my reply.

Some people say I am very hard on the liquor men. Well, I know others say things about the rum men that I would not say. One temperance lecturer compared the saloon man to a dog. I have never done this. I have a dog of my own, and I love it too much to insult it by comparing it to a rum seller.

The evil of the liquor trade is not realized by our people. As soon as they understand what an enemy it is to all progress, they will rise in their might and sweep it out of existence. Only those who have lost some loved one by its ravages can understand fully the terrible effects it brings in its train.

The lecturer then produced a roll 36 yards long, made up of clippings from newspapers, showing the number of murders suicides, wife beating, assaults and crimes committed while men were under the influence of intoxicating liquor. In two weeks there were 3292 crimes committed, ranging from murder down.

Wherever I go the police get busy. They seem to think that by locking up the poor drunkard they please me. Get after the rum sellers, not their victims.

In Moncton the magistrate there sentenced seven men to jail, and although some of these people were seen talking to the chief of police, they could not be caught.

The liquor men—law breakers—are allowed to walk the streets of Glace Bay. It is a wonder they are allowed to live in the town. Every one of these men should be in jail. I intend to tear the robe of respectability off these people and show them up in their true colors. Their trade is a dirty one, and everybody should know this fact. Every rum shop in town is a menace to your boy and girl. Don't give the town council, the inspector—I beg your pardon—inspectors any rest until they clear the whole business out of town.

I remember receiving a blue paper once from the chief of police, telling me the rum sellers were very angry at what I had said, and advising me to keep indoors. I told this man that I was a law-abiding citizen and didn't intend to be fooled by either him or the rum seller. They are a cowardly lot, anyway.

If the magistrates of the place don't do their duty, kick them out. I don't understand why you should bring theatrical troupes here. Why, all that is necessary is to go into some of the courts and you can see a farce any day free of charge.

I put some of the big bugs of P E I

on the side of the devil in the tug of war. They were indignant, but I told them I had placed them in the right place. They threatened me with libel and all sorts of things. I wish someone would get after me for libel on anything I say. I would give these people an uneasy half hour in the court. At the time of strikes the saloon is always full. We are told don't rob the poor man of his beer. We don't want to rob the poor man of his beer, but we want to rob the saloon of the poor man.

Give a man a drink of whiskey and he will settle questions that have been troubling Sir Wilfrid Laurier since he went into politics. They will settle questions that even Hon G H Murray would be confused in settling them. I even think that Representative Gillis would find some difficulty in solving questions that are settled off hand by these whiskey-wise personages.

Why should we not have the liquor traffic broke up? You are the masters of the situation. You are the masters of the town council and all the town officials. They are your servants and you see that they carry out your wishes.

Some people tell me the liquor men are generous, and they give to the Church. I don't think the Church should take one dollar from men who make it in grog shop. God's work should not be carried on with the money of rum sellers. Those who accept money from the rum sellers with which to do God's work are in the worse position than those people who sold Christ for thirty pieces of silver. There is a curse on the liquor traffic, and their money is no good.

A liquor dealer is not fit to hold any office in the gift of a Christian people. Put him in his proper place, between the four walls of a Jail—that is the only place for him, so that you and your money be safe.

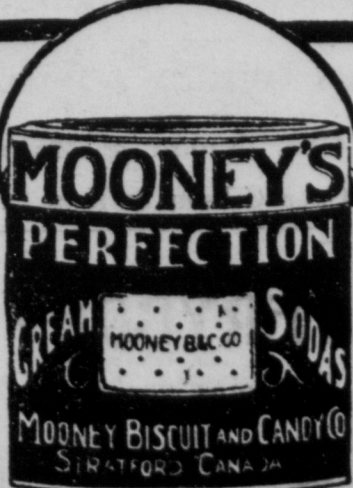

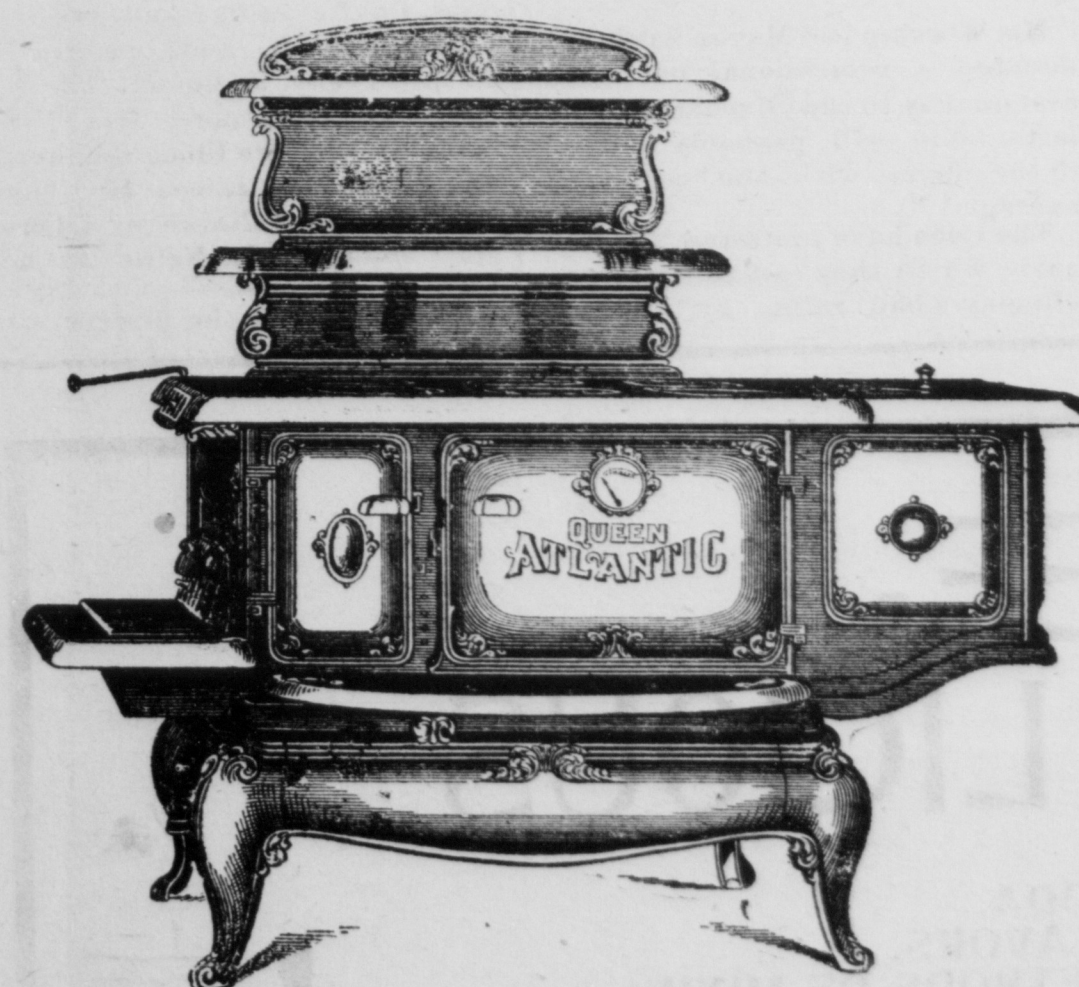
