

With respect to the Street Department, I would say that the same excuse does not, in my opinion, hold good. No good reason can be shown for the large expenditure in excess of the estimate, as was done during the last year, and we sincerely trust that it will not occur again.

I would strongly urge you to carefully consider in making up the estimates for the current year, the maximum amount that we can afford to expend to maintain any of the Departments, and then endeavor to keep the expenditure down to the minimum consistent with efficiency. Notwithstanding the over expenditures in these Departments the past year was a memorable one, being the first year for many years, that the Town Treasurer's books did

not show the usual deficit.

The past year is also a memorable one in another respect, in that we have as compared with other Towns, in a manner declared against Municipal Ownership of Public Utilities. 00. For upwards of twenty years the Town has owned and maintained its own Street Electric Lighting Plant During the past year a Contract was entered into with an Electric Lighting Company to light the streets of the Town, and to furnish Power to Pump the Water Supply of the Town, for a period of five years. The contract calls for the operation of 40-1200 c p enclosed Arc Lamps on the Streets, from one hour after sunset until one o'clock, moon-light schedule, and for Electric Power to Pump 125 million gallons of water each year. We have to pay for this service \$3275.00 per year. The Electric Light was turned on the first time on the night of the 2nd inst. We expect to have the Power Pump and Motor in operation by April 10th next. Until that date the cost of the per year, per Lamp.
