SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS. Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Entry must be made personally at the local and office for the district in which the land is situate. The homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six month's residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three

(2) If the father (or mother,) if the father is deceased) of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such persons residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

Six month's notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for patent.

THE TRANSCONTINENTAL.

Our good Tory friends who have so confidently peedicted that the government had no intention of constructing the eastern section of the Transcontinental Railway, will no doubt be disappointed in observing that that very soon tenders for the construction of the divisions between Quebec and Grand Falls and from Chipman to Moncton will be invited and that as soon as a decision is reached as to the adoption on the valley or back route, the whole line will be placed under contract.

The business has reached a stage at which even the most ardent Tory doubter is no longer able to cast diseredit on the good faith and intention of the government in the matter and this is a condition that will not prove satisfactory to the opponents of the administration.

We have no doubt that months ago the government would have been able to proceed with the work of constructing the eastern section, but that surveys of the Grand Falls-Chipman section were ordered to be made all over again at the instance of the friends of the valley route, who felt that in the earlier survey the engineers had not given sufficient attention to the claims of that route.
