### Capt Nielson's Address.

Woodstock, Jan. 12th, 1907.

To the Citizens and Friends in general including Ladies as well as Gentlemen wither they be present here to night or not we extend our hearty thanks for the way you have helped us with your funds, believe us, when we say, that we are indeed thankful to you all for without your noble help we would have been at a standstill but we also feel in our hearts that you are perfectly satisfied in the way we have used your freely given money, for this building is indeed yours as well as ours. May God bless you all for your kindness to the Army in this town. Next we now turn our attention to our own Staff with Brigadier J W B Turner as its Leader and Friend. Welcome welcome to our midst this evening. Our glorious little Army that has existed in this town for nearly 22 years has labored faithfully and under trying circumstances in that period of time. Yea we say under trying circumstances for indeed it is true. Only but a short time ago we had no place whatever wherein to go and worship God and several of those we did have was by no means of the best. But Brigadier, we put before you at your Headquarters in St John our plea for assistance and you at once seeing our great need for help was not long in considering it, and your efforts which you at once started in securing a building which we now call our own has indeed not been in vain for you are tonight seated in an Army Building second to none in the province, sincerely thank you our beloved Leader for what you have done for us. At last but by no means least we extend to our builders Ensign Freeman and Lieut Stairs our hearty thanks as also Capt Willard the Officer in charge of the corps here comes in for the same share for his skilful management as the Officer in charge of the Financial Part. Now a great deal of thanks has been extended to all in this our address this evening, and it is no more than right, but what it should be done, but let us not forget to offer up the greatest thanks of all to our heavenly Father, to Jesus our Redeemer and Friend for his loving kindness and tender mercy which he has bestowed upon us all.
