

### BY LAW ON BEER.

The legislation for which the Town Council is asking, contains a provision by virtue of which power is sought to pass a by-law regulating the sale of non-intoxicating drinks, such as lager beer, ginger beer, soda water, etc. The idea of those behind the measure, is we think, largely along the lines of putting the traffic more in the open. No complaint is made concerning the soda water men. What the promoters do ask, however, is to be placed in a position whereby beer must be sold just as publicly as soda water is now served. There must be no screens, back rooms, or any other device to hide the traffic. This, we believe, is the pith of the whole matter. Perhaps in the case of lager there will be an age limit keeping it from very young boys, and no doubt beer licenses will contain a proviso calling for early closing. The idea of a high license will scarcely receive undivided approval and we may safely assume that it is not the intention of the Council to make any money. What action the Legislature will take remains to be seen. There will certainly be some opposition.

### JUST AS WE PREDICTED.

The Mayor's little reception in the Council Chamber Friday night was attended by about a score of rate-payers. There were addresses by His Worship, ex-Warden Bailey and ex-Mayor Belyea. All were in favor of fixing the engine, as of course any sane man would be. The meeting decided to recommend the repairs put on at once. The mayor, of course, very bravely had a little characteristic fling at this paper, behind the back of any representative. The next time he had anything to say let him wait until there is someone there to answer him.

### THE CONSERVATIVE TICKET.

We are not going to follow the foolish tactics of the opposition organ and say that the other fellows have nominated a very weak ticket, when every man who has a mind of his own knows the very reverse to be the case. We will give credit where it is due, and state right here that the Conservative Convention by its action on Saturday last placed a strong ticket in the field—perhaps the strongest three available,—yet without that a ticket in no way superior, and in many respects inferior, to Messrs Jones, Carvell and McCain, the opposition ticket.

We do not think Mayor Munro or any of his friends will claim for the chief magistrate a degree of strength at all commensurate with that of Mr Hartley, who in 1903 was an opposition candidate, but in the present fight is far too wise to play the part. As to Messrs Smith and Flemming, they barely secured election last time when luck was with them, as well as the advantage gained by unfortunate dissensions within the government ranks (now, happily, healed and forgotten,) and if that was the best they could do struggling with the wind and tide, where will they be when the elements are against them? Compared with the government nominees, Messrs Smith Flemming and Munro are by no means an improvement. The Solicitor General is certainly quite as intelligent as the Mayor, Mr McCain is just as capable as Mr Smith, and surely the benefit of Harry Carvell's solid common sense would be better for the country than all the pleasing though ineffective platitudes Mr Flemming could utter in the next five years.

The nomination of Mayor Munro is the culmination of an idea that first developed over two years ago. In his campaign for the mayoralty of 1906 it will be remembered that H D Stevens was first in the field, and although a pretty stiff conservative, the Liberals had no thought of opposing him. In a week or so Mr Munro took the field in response to the request of a machine delegation. The outcome need not be given. The factional fight resulted in but a small Liberal vote going to the polls, but of the conservatives, every man the machine could pull, voted for Munro. After the election the leaders told the defeated candidate that he had to be unmercifully slaughtered in order to make the other man appear exceedingly popular, and therefore in line as a candidate for higher honors. Evidently those who planned the plot knew what they were doing.

We predict right here, and if we are wrong we desire someone to remind us, that Carleton County will return the Liberal ticket.
