FUNERAL OF LATE LT. GOV. ERNOR SNOWBALL.

Representative Attendance at Last Solemn Ceremonies.

Chatham, N.B., Feb. 27.—The funeral of the late Lieut. Governor Snowball was the most largely attended that was ever held in this town. Among those who arrived yesterday and to-day to attend the funeral were Hon D. C. Fraser, Lieut. Governor of Nova Scotia, Hon H. R. Emmerson, Attorney General Pugsley, Hon F. J. Sweeney, Hon L. P. Farris, Hon C. W. Robinson, C. J. Osman, M. P. P., George Robertson, M. P. P., Edward Lantallum, M. P. P., Donald Morrison, J. Morrissey, Lieut. Col. White representing the Quebec Government, Lieut. Col. Drury, representing the Governor General, Mrs. J. L. Black, Sackville, sister of the Governor, Frank B. Black, Walter Black, Sackville; Geo. H. Trueman, Moncton; Rev. James Strothard, Moncton; Wm. Currie, M. P. P., Restigouche; A. B. Copp, Hon F. P. Thompson, Alex. Thompson, R. S. Barker. The funeral services were held at 3.30 o'clock at Wellingtonville, the Governor's late residence. Rev. G. A. Sellar conducted the services and was assisted by Rev. Jas. Strothard and Rev. J. M. MacLean.

Other clergymen present were Rev. Fr. O'Keefe, Rev. D. Henderson. The opening hymn was "Son of My Soul," the late Governor's favorite hymn. St. Luke's Church choir leading in the singing. Rev. Jas. Strothard offered prayer and after the reading of the lessons the services concluded. The cortege formed as follows:—School Children, 73rd Regimental Band, Physicians, Clergymen, Pall Bearers, Premier Tweedie and Attorney General Pugsley, Hon C. W. Robinson and Hon L. P. P., High Sheriff of Northumberland County, Judge Wilkinson, the Mayor and Town Council, the magistrate and town officials, County Councilors and employees.

Verdict for Dr. Pierce

Sending truth after a lie. WORTH WATCHING.

Mr. Hazen at the Woodstock Tory convention, declared that he was for clean elections, and was willing to enter into a compact with the government to spend no money in the coming contest to debauch the electors.

We trust Mr. Hazen's reform in this respect is sincere, but up to the present the elections in which he has been concerned have not been noted for purity. In his contests for the legislature, money flowed very freely in his behalf. During his last campaign in Sunbury the government candidates who opposed Mr. Hazen, were met and overcome by the free expenditure of money, the price of votes soaring up to an enormous figure through the fatness of the opposition purse.

If however, Mr. Hazen has decided to countenance only clean election methods the country will be glad to hear of the reformation, but may be chary of accepting to the full the declaration that the Tory party will stick to proper methods of promoting the success of their candidates.

Instances have been known in New Brunswick of loud Tory protestations of good intentions, to deceive their opponents and when polling day arrived the agents of the party were found plentifully supplied with the "resources of civilization," and used them to good advantage.

It has generally been accepted that when the Tory party shouts purity, it is because it is lacking in means. There were no declarations of purity from that source when the Tories controlled the government at Ottawa and were able to levy on contractors and other friends for election funds.—Herald
