Governor and Premier.

On Saturday the Hon Lemuel J Tweedie, premier of New Brunswick, was appointed Lieutenant Governor. He took the oath of office at Fredericton on Tuesday afternoon, and immediately called upon Hon William Pugsley to form an administration. The new Governor is of Irish descent, and has been in political life ever since 1874, when as a mere stripling of 25, he was elected to the Legislature from Northumberland. Since that date, save for one brief period of four years, he has been a member of the Assembly. In 1890 he entered the Blair administration as Surveyor General, and continued in that position until he became provincial secretary under Hon James Mitchell's premiership, as well as that of Hon H R Emmerson, whom he succeeded as premier in 1900. In religion he is a Presbyterian, and by profession a

Hon Wm Pugsley, the new premier, is a native of Kings Co who for many years has been the recognized leader of the New Brunswick bar. Each physician will pick out certain of his debtors whom he will put on the Black List. This List he will pass to each of the other doctors. When a man who has been black listed by one doctor, calls on another for treatment, he will be refused and sent back to his former attendant, until he has paid up all arrears, and will be subject to the mercy of the doctor who places him on the Black

There is not one medical man in Woodstock, who is not willing and who does not do a great deal of charitable work every year; but it is no act of charity to doctor the lazy fellow, who employs a new one every time to avoid paying the old one. Some of these fellows are apparently the most independent patients we have to deal with and the hardest to please.
