Mr Hazen and the Highway Act.

Mr Hazen's chief card against the Government is the Highway Act, a measure for which they ought to receive the highest praise. Yet when the Highway bill was before the House he accepted the principle of it and the only serious objection that he made to it was that the money collected for the highways should be expended by the Municipal Councils and not by the Government. During the discussion of the bill Mr Hazen said:

"One purpose of the bill is to do away with the distinction between Highways and Byeways. With this section I heartily agree as the necessity for the distinction has long since disappeared. Another purpose is the abolition of Statute Labor. While I feel that this measure in the imposing of a direct money tax will be a great hardship on the poor people, yet it will be a great advantage if the money is properly expended. In many cases the statute labor is not performed and the Country gets nothing in return for the tax."

Here Mr Hazen puts himself on record as opposed to the system of Statute labor on the roads and yet he now proposes if he gets into power to repeal the Highway Act and return to the system of Statute Labor. It is hardly necessary to make any comments on such extraordinary inconsistency on the part of the leader of the Opposition. It is evident that instead of endeavouring to co-operate with the Government in the necessary work of obtaining good roads he is only concerned to excite prejudices against the measure on the most frivolous grounds. The Highway Act will vindicate itself because it is based on reason and common sense and is a progressive measure. (Transcript)

Hazen Decries the Province.

There is an old proverb about a bird and a nest which seems peculiarly applicable to the leader of the local opposition and those who have been travelling with him in his campaign through the country. These gentlemen have been telling their hearers that the Province of New Brunswick is bankrupt, and they seem to be rather pleased to say that such is the case. Of course everyone who has given the slightest attention to the subject of our Provincial finances knows that the statements made by Mr Hazen are foolish and wicked slander. Mr Hazen, who is a native of this Province, and whose interests are all in New Brunswick, should be above uttering such ridiculous misrepresentations. Everyone knows that in recent years the price of money has advanced and that loans cannot be effected on as favorable terms now as was possible a few years ago. The best illustration of this fact will be found in the price of British Consols, a standard security which has always been considered the best in the world. In the year 1897 British Consols sold for 113½, and during that year never went lower than 110½. The latest quotation for British Consols in the London mar-

ket is 82 1-16, so that the price of Consols has fallen more than 31½ points in ten years. This result has been brought about by the great demand for money, caused by the war in which the nations have been engaged, and by the vast industrial enterprises which demand large amounts of capital. Under these circumstances, the Provincial Government is acting with great prudence in not endeavoring to effect a permanent loan at the present time but contenting itself with issuing short term bonds, until the money market is in a more favorable condition. There is no province in Canada which is in a sounder financial condition than New Brunswick, and none whose securities deserve to stand higher. Mr Hazen should give up this foolish outcry against the credit of his native Province. Transcript.
